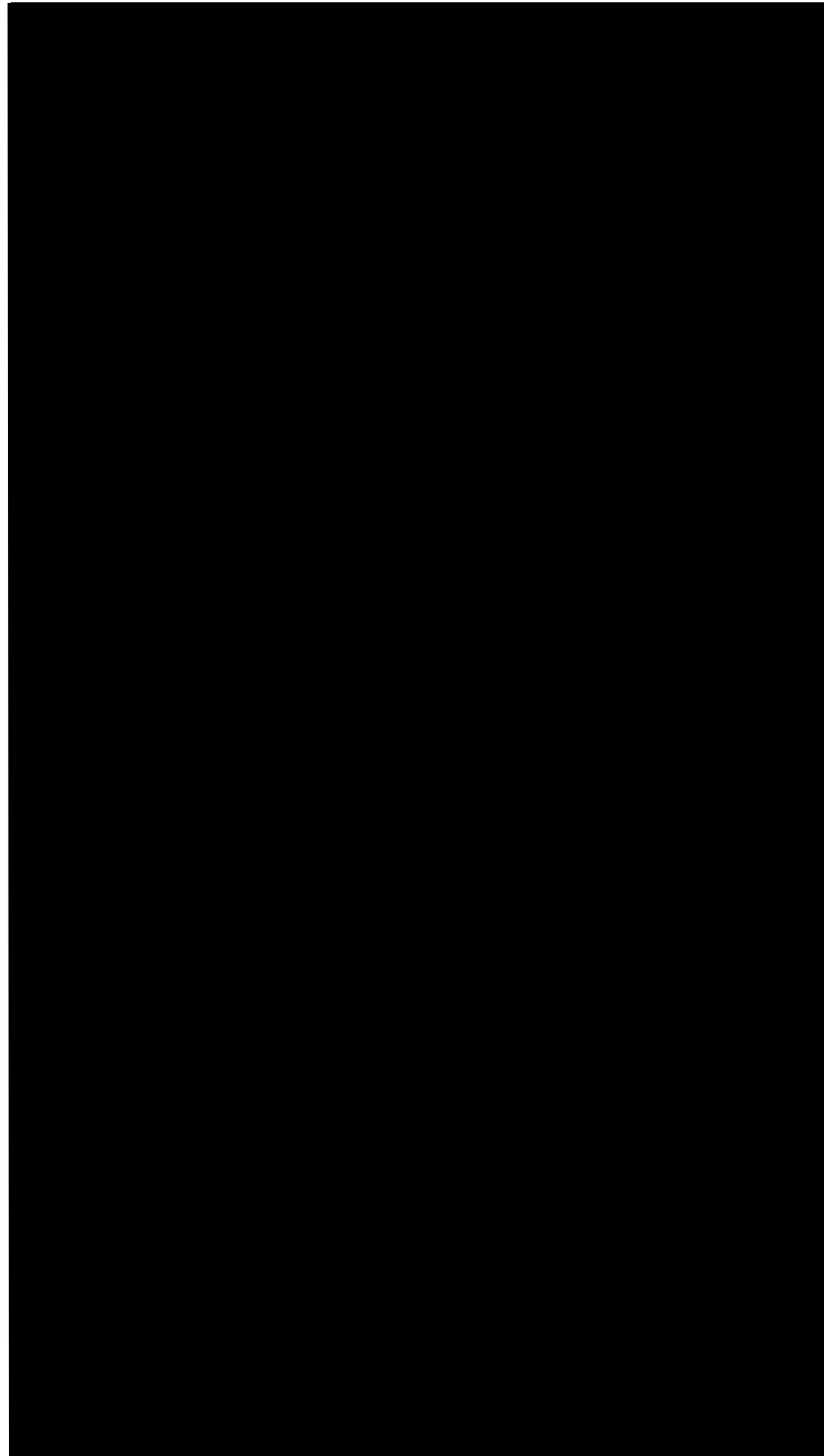

**From Father Brian's Desk**

**Safety Concerns**

As we enter a new year, I want to remind everyone about a few safety issues that some parishioners and the Lemont Police Department have brought to my attention:

1. Even though we would like to make our way to our automobiles as fast as possible after Mass is over, I would advise everyone who is parked west of State Street and Lemont Road to please use the designated crosswalk with the yellow pedestrian sign and lights. I know that some people would like to save some time and enter the crossing in the middle of the street, but it is extremely dangerous. Please use the designated crosswalk to safely cross the street.
2. I know that the amount of parking spaces we offer is extremely limited, but we have had a number of complaints about the lack of access to our parking lot during Masses due to cars blocking the entrances/exits. Please be considerate of others and do not park in areas that are designated as "No Parking Zones". We want to keep the access points clear for any Emergency vehicles to enter so they can provide assistance.

Welcome Guests and Visitors. We are so glad that you are here and invite you to join us in thanksgiving for God's presence in our lives. Our goal is to provide a spiritual home where all are welcome, where the healing, reconciling, love of God flows through us to all people. In this way, we believe that the Church is the sacrament of God's presence in the world.

*"Please come to Mass early enough not to disrupt. Leave late enough not to insult (the Mass does not end until the final blessing). Worship reverently enough not to distract. And dress proudly enough not to offend."*

### Reflecting on God's Word

What are the major attractions in your area? Are they natural wonders, spectacular buildings, engaging activities, powerful people, works of art? We expect people to stream to Las Vegas, to Hollywood, to New York City, to Paris, to London, to Rome, to the Eiffel Tower and the Grand Canyon. In today's scriptures, however, we see tourists attracted to two very lowly and humble sights.

Jerusalem was a sorry sight when the prophet Isaiah was written. The prophet must have seemed impossible to those who heard this message. And yet, today's Jerusalem is a major tourist attraction. We also know that through the Jews many other people Christians and Muslims have been attracted to the one Lord.

Jesus himself must have seemed very weak and insignificant in comparison to the rich and powerful King Herod, and later on compared to the priests and Pharisees. Yet his birth from people streamed to him. Like the tourists in today's Gospel, people saw something in him that drew them to him and serve the Lord. And through him they came to understand what God intended for their life journeys.

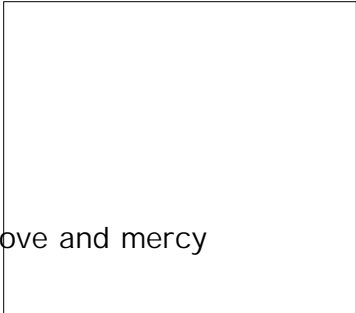

## REMEMBERING OUR YEAR

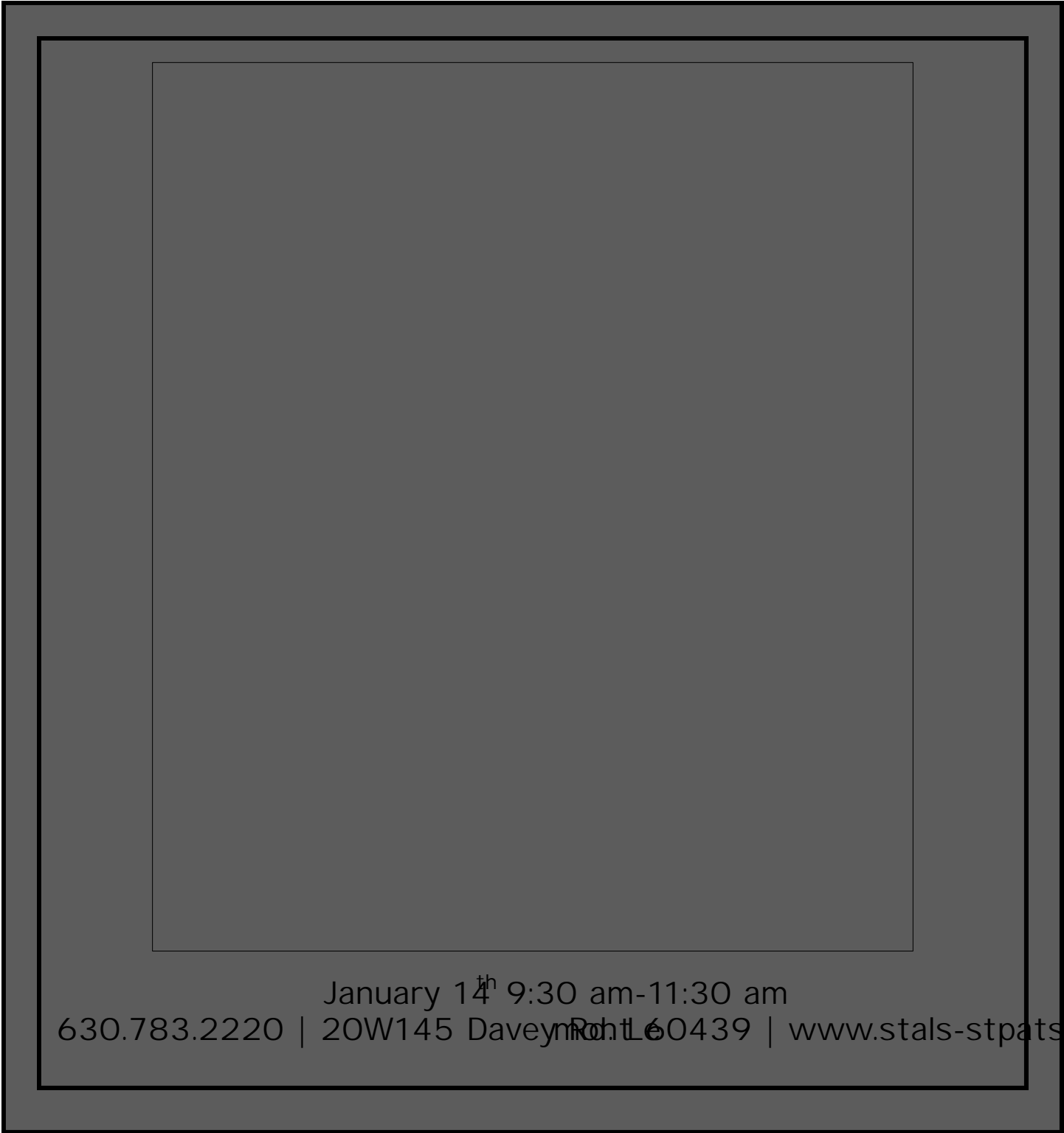

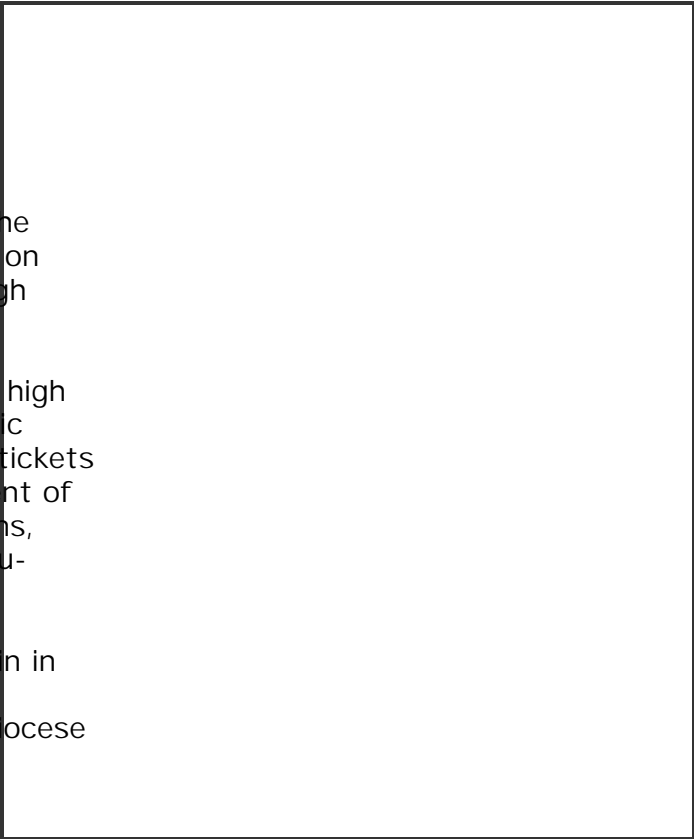

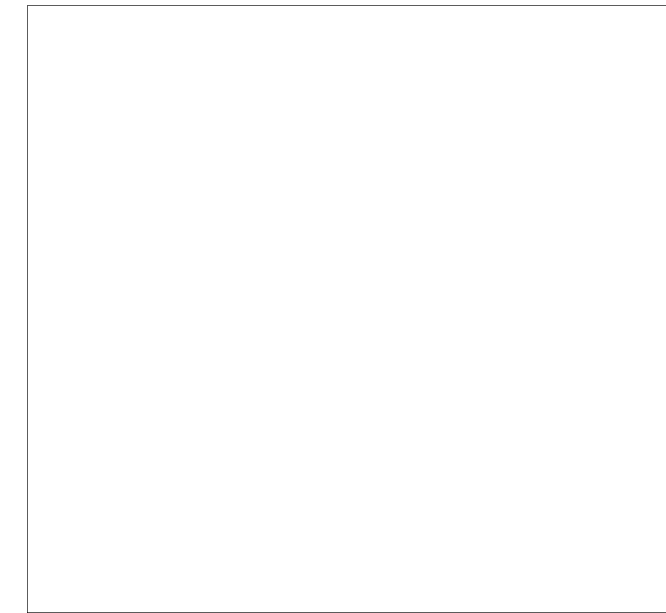
