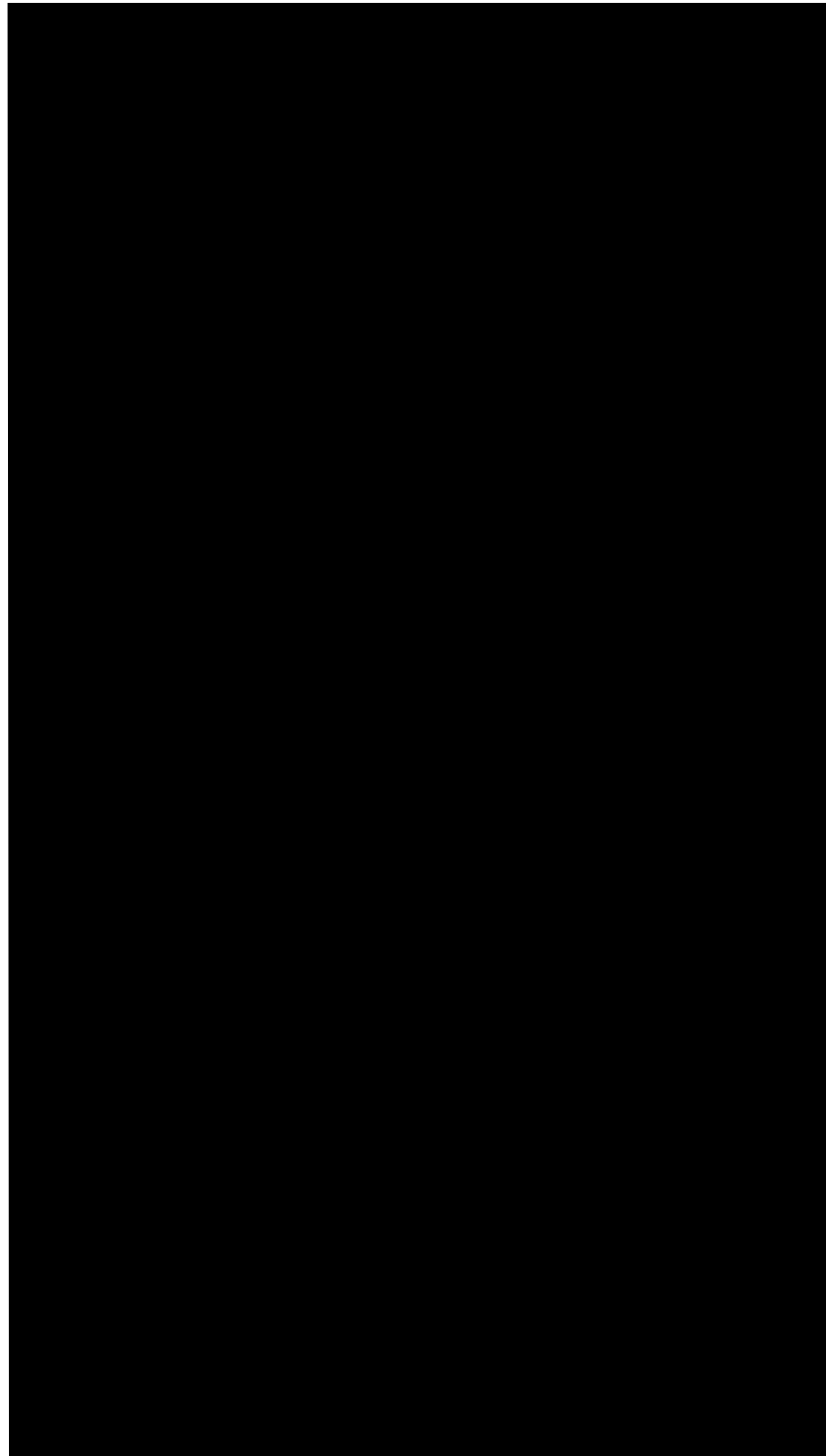

They responded to Jesus because he was a master worthy of their trust and because he invited them to be his disciples, to walk at his side and to *follow* his ways. People followed them not because of their words, because they knew the way.

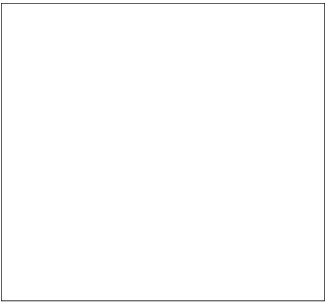

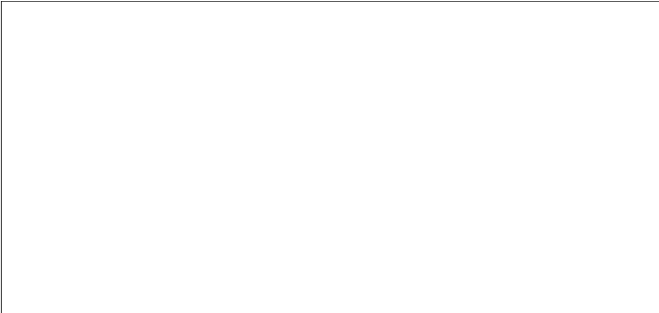
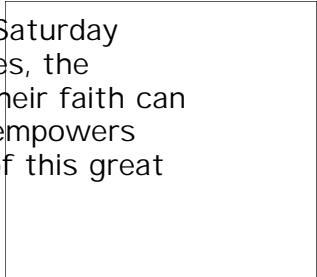

CONFIRMATION RETREAT



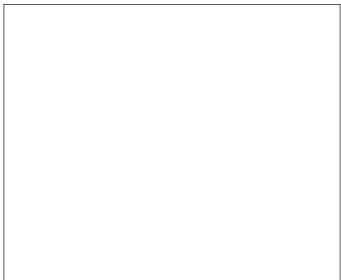
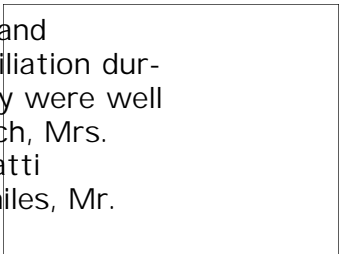

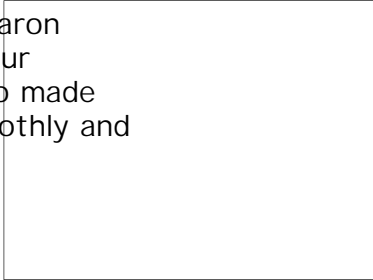
FIRST RECONCILIATION

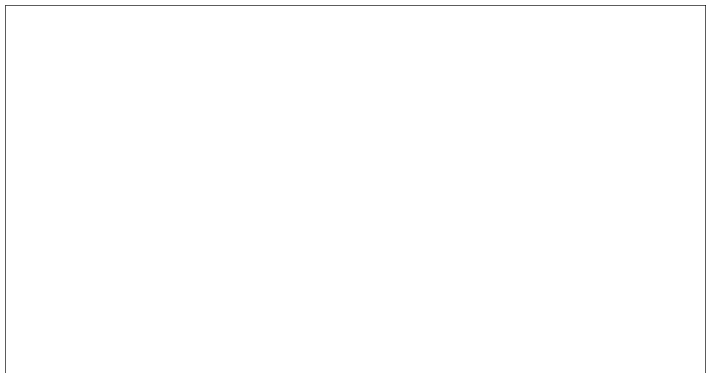
