### Reflecting on God's Word

Hearing Jesus' words, I am the vine, you are the branches, comforting at first. But then comes and my Father is the vine grower (John 15:1). The task of the vine grower and pruning can be tricky. The danger is cutting the main vine and not the branches, or cutting the branches that carry this year's fruit and not the old ones from last year. But Jesus tells us that it is the Father who is out there pruning with his shears, not some hired hand. He is cutting away the dead wood, and cutting back branches so they bear even more fruit.

Nevertheless, you might think, who wants to be pruned? Who wants God snipping away? It's hard to be pruned. There is a dying in that. But that is the ongoing story of Easter: dying and rising, pruning and fruit. God is there pruning us to bring out life, to make us life givers. The Father continues snipping away, separating us from our selfishness, our self-centeredness, these things we hold on to that do not give us life: resentments, old grievances, desires for getting even.

God is about life, committed to an abundance of life, not just today but eternal life. That's the divine plan. Are we part of it?

Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth. John's message comes to us on this day when the Gospel presents us with the great image of the vine and the branches. Jesus uses the image as a warning to those who have begun to distance themselves from the Lord. One of the ways this happens is when we love God only in word or speech instead of in deed and truth. What does it mean to remain in Christ? In an extension of the metaphor, the Lord gives us strength if we remain in him, we will bear much fruit. As the branches draw strength from Christ who is the vine. This strength enables us to bear the fruit of the work of true discipleship.

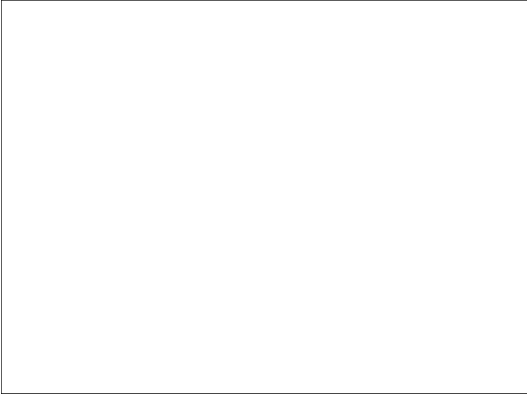
where the pastor explained how the food pantry works, and how someone their age can help out.

## YEAH!! WE HAVE A NEW PLAYGROUND

Our new playground was installed this past weekend. I think it was wonderful experience for everyone. Our students are so fortunate!

The project for a new playground was initiated by our Family School Association. Knowing the FSA had a savings that could go toward the adventure, Julie Malone and Sandra (FSA) shared their proposal with Fr. Brian, Fr. Kurt and myself in early fall. At that time FSA did not have sufficient funds to pay the entire cost of the playground. It decided that FSA would continue making plans for the project and use dollars collected at the GALA fund an item.

In the meantime Mr. Mike Bruno and Mr. Bob Parry (husband of teacher) were talking and Mike shared with Bob the school's plan for a new playground. From that conversation came a desire from the Parrys and their daughter Dana, to help fund this project. (In August, Dana suffered the loss of her husband, Brent, in a hiking accident. Both Dana and Brent loved the outdoors hiking, biking, etc. In tribute to Brent, Dana decided to donate funds to our playground project. (Brent, being an architect was creating a playground in a nearby park.) Donations flowed in from Dana and Brent's families and friends. They donated \$26,000 to this project. The dollars from this collection, fund an item monies of \$16,000 from FSA and donations from several individuals and companies allowed us to continue with our installation of the playground at this time.

Last weekend a memorable event unfolded. Dana, the Parry families and many of their friends, parents of our school children and teachers came out to help in the playground. Seeing the creation of this project come into being was incredible; so many people pulling together to create a wonderful playground for our students. This project involved hundreds of nuts, bolts and screws and many wheelbarrows full of mulch being carted from the back parking lot to the playground area. Anyone who came on Saturday and Sunday was put to work. The building of the playground not only provided a play area for our students but brought people together and afforded us an opportunity to know Dana, as well as Dana and Brent's families and friends, and for our parents to create new friendships with other school families that perhaps they never would have met.

We are extremely grateful to all who were a part of this success. On Tuesday, when I was showing the students the playground and explaining what each component did, the students were saying thank you. A little one even gave me a huge hug and said, Thank you for doing this for us. (It was a stand in for that hug. The hug and statement were really for all who took part in this adventure for our students.) More thank you's and pictures will be in next week's newsletter. 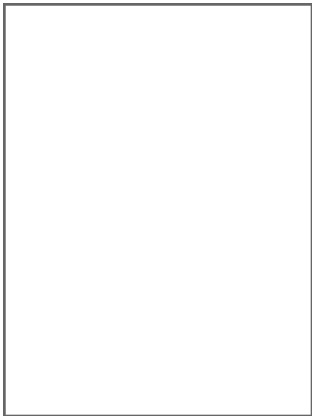

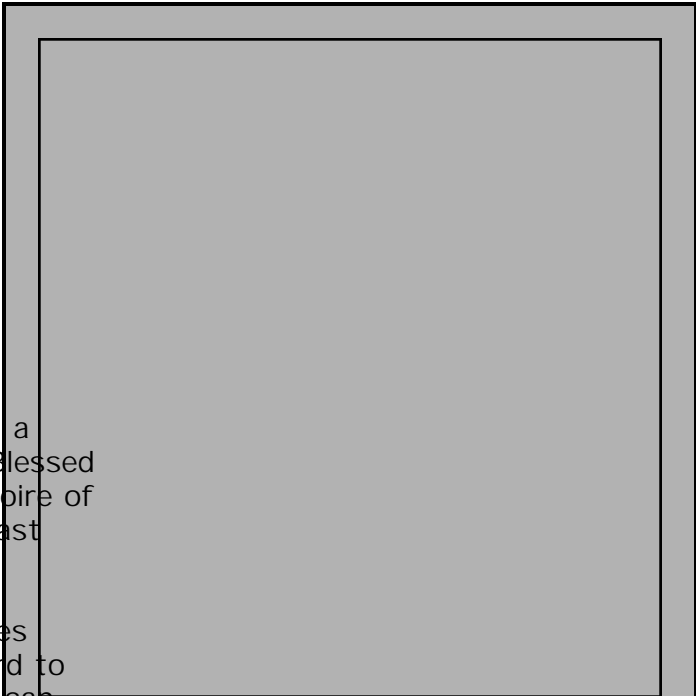

### LOOPS OF LOVE MEETING



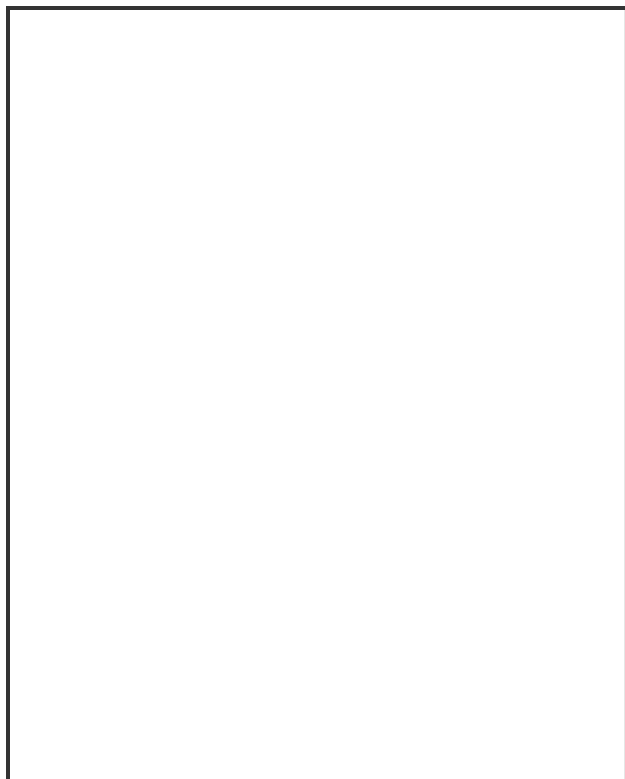
