Mother's Day

As we celebrate Mother's Day, I found an inspiring reflection from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops about this special day:

"Our readings today speak to us of God's command to love. We are called to: Listen to God. Care for the needs of others. Lay down our lives for the good of another.

This is, in a unique way, the very vocation of motherhood: Listening. Caring for the needs of others. Laying down one's life for another.

A mother's love is first seen even before a woman becomes a mother. A husband and wife's mutual desire to conceive a child in itself demonstrates their fatherly and motherly love. And their love for one another extends to the child they lovingly desire to conceive.

Not much is stronger than a mother's love for her child. Our mothers, together with our fathers, are the ones who first teach us about love and how to respond to others in need.

The Church, in many ways, is also a mother to us. She teaches us how to love and to respond to those in need. From her we receive the grace of the sacraments, are taught to hear the word of God, and receive teaching to guide our steps in the truth and freedom of the children of God.

Today, in a special way, let us be grateful for: Our mothers, by birth or adoption, who nurtured us and supported us through life. Our Church who takes on the maternal role of guiding us through life. And our Blessed Mother, who protects both the Church and all her children."

"Please come to Mass early enough not to disrupt. Leave late enough not to insult (the Mass does not end until the final blessing). Worship reverently enough not to distract. And dress proudly enough not to offend."

Reflecting on God's Word

As a nation, we are a mobile people. Not only do we travel around during vacations, for special events, and for visiting family and friends, but we readily move from one place to another for college, work, health reasons, and finally retirement. While previous generations usually stayed with one job and in one house for practically all of their lives, today it is common to move from one place to another, to a different state or even to a different country. This mobility carries over into our relationships. We can find that our lives take us from one set of friends to another, from one close relationship to another.

So Jesus' admonition to remain in his love can sound quite challenging to people whose lives are characterized by change and impermanence. The word "remain" is sometimes translated as "abide." The meaning of this invitation is to "take up permanent residence." Last week Jesus called us to "remain" in his word; this week, to "remain in my love" (John 15:9).

Jesus tells us how to do this (by keeping his commandments), why we should do this (so that his joy might be in us and our joy complete), what specifically we should do (love one another as I have loved you, that is, by laying down my life for you), and what is to be gained by doing this (an ongoing friendship with him that bears fruit and gains whatever we ask the Father in his name).

Not a bad exchange for settling down . . . in his love.

Living God's Word

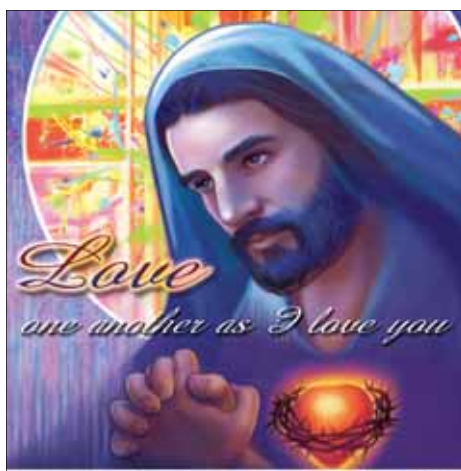

Today's second reading and Gospel together create a great hymn to love. The chorus of this hymn is simple—God loves us so much that Jesus was sent into the world so that we would have life. In a world marked by division and terrorism, the Lord's final words in today's Gospel are a great challenge: "This I command you: love one another."

The Joy of the Gospel - Evangelii Gaudium - Pope Francis Issued in November of 2013



The Joy of the Gospel is the first Apostolic Exhortation issued by Pope Francis and is devoted to the theme of the New Evangelization.

New Evangelization-what does that mean and what does it mean to St. Alphonsus?

Jesus is the best example of a Spirit-Filled Evangelizer

“Jesus himself is the model of this method of evangelization which brings us to the very heart of his people. How good it is for us to contemplate the closeness which he shows to everyone! If he speaks to someone, he looks into their eyes with deep love and concern: ‘Jesus, looking upon him, loved him’ (Mk 10:21). We see how accessible he is, as he draws near the blind man (cf. Mk 10:46-52 and eats and drinks with sinners (cf. Mk 2:16 without worrying about being thought a glutton and a drunkard himself (cf. MK 11:19). We see his sensitivity in allowing a sinful woman to anoint his feet (cf: Lk 7:36-50) and in receiving Nicodemus by night (cf. Jn 3:1-15)...Moved by his example, we want to enter fully the fabric of society, sharing the lives of all, listening to their concerns, helping them materially and spiritually in their needs, rejoicing with those who rejoice, weeping with those who weep; arm in arm with others, we are committed to building a new world. But we do so not with a sense of obligation, not as a burdensome duty, but as the result of a personal decision which brings us joy and gives meaning to our lives.’ (269)

Jesus left us his mother to be our mother

“At that crucial moment, before fully accomplishing the work which his Father had entrusted to him, Jesus said to Mary: ‘Woman here is your son.’ Then he said to his beloved friend: ‘Here is your mother’ (Jn 19:26-27. These words of the dying Jesus are not chiefly the expression of his devotion and concern for his mother; rather, they are a revelatory formula which manifests the mystery of a special mission. ...The Lord did not want to leave the Church without this icon of womanhood. ‘

Then the Pope goes on to explain who Mary was/is to us now. “She is the woman whose heart was pierced by a sword and who understands all our pain. As mother of all, she is a sign of hope for peoples suffering the birth pangs of justice... Here they find strength from God to bear witness and the suffering in their lives. As she did with Juan Diego, Mary offers them maternal comfort and love, and whispers in their ear: “Let your heart not be troubled...Am I not here, who am your mother?” (286) “This interplay of justice and tenderness, of contemplation and concern for others, is what makes the ecclesial community look to Mary as the model of evangelization. We implore her maternal intercession that the Church may become a home for many people, a mother for all peoples, and that the way may be opened to the birth of our new world.” (288)

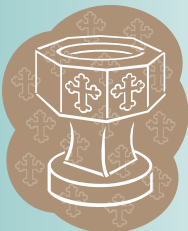

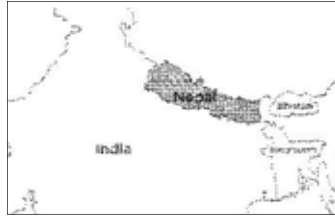
