From Father Brian's Desk

Priesthood Anniversaries

On Saturday, May 16th, the Archdiocese of Chicago welcomed 14 new priests to ministry. They will begin their new assignments on July 1st and they have walked varied paths toward priesthood ordination. Some are American born, while others come from different countries. We pray for them as they begin their new journey in life proclaiming the Gospel message in everything they say and do.

May is the month in which many Priesthood Ordinations take place. I would like to congratulate the priests in the Lemont area for their years of service: **Fr. Richard Shannon** (56 years), **Fr. Lou Zake** (55 years), **Fr. Bob Rohrich** (54 years), **Fr. Bob Lucas** (41 years), **Fr. Larry Gorski** (40 years), **Fr. Tom Koys** of St. James at Sag Bridge (30 years), **Fr. Kurt Boras** of St. Patrick (29 years) and **Fr. Waldemar Stawiariski** of Ss. Cyril & Methodius (12 years). To those who serve our communities – *Ad Multos Annos* (Many Happy Years)!

Tri-Parish Weekday Morning Mass

In keeping with the tradition that began a few years ago, the Catholic Communities of St. Alphonsus, Ss. Cyril & Methodius and St. Patrick will move to a **Tri-Parish Weekday Morning Mass** schedule starting **Monday, June 1st** and concluding on **August 31st**. One parish will serve as the “host parish” for the 7:30 a.m. Morning Mass (Monday – Saturday). The Mass intentions will be collected from each parish and celebrated together by the priest assigned to that specific Mass.

St. Alphonsus Church will host the first month of the Tri-Parish Weekday Masses in the church beginning on **Monday, June 1st** and concluding on **Tuesday, June 30th**. From there the Tri-Parish Mass will travel to St. Patrick Church for the month of July and then move to Ss. Cyril and Methodius for the month of August. The complete summer schedule will continue to be posted in the bulletin for the next few weeks.

For those who are early risers (and for those who like to sleep in), please note that **Our Lady of the Woods Church** in Orland Park, on 131st Street, has weekday morning Masses celebrated at 6:30 AM and 8:30 AM. **St James Parish at the Sag Bridge** has weekday Masses celebrated on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday at 8:15 AM and on Wednesday night at 7:00PM.

One of the great things about being Catholic is our ability to pray and worship in unison with our brothers and sisters when we gather for the Eucharist. Let us pray that we can continue sharing that same spirit as we continue our journeys of faith.

Church Security

Finally, I want to inform everyone that, since Easter, there have been a number of theft attempts from the donation containers near the votive candles and the Food Pantry donation box. We have made police reports in regards to this issue. We were then informed by the police that some of the surrounding churches (including St. Patrick and Ss. Cyril and Methodius) were also victimized. Because of this discouraging incident, we have decided to install additional outside lighting near our emergency side doors and we are now in the process of exploring security systems for our various buildings.

YEAR OF SACRAMENTS • ONE WORD AT A TIME

Change

We believe that in the Mass, when the priest invokes the Holy Spirit and repeats the words of Jesus, the elements of bread and wine are **changed** into the reality of his Body and Blood. In faith, we can affirm *that* this happens, but we cannot explain with any precision *how* it happens, as much as we might want to. The how remains a mystery. And there is another important dimension of change that calls for our close attention.

Not only do the elements of bread and wine change, but we who take within ourselves the Body and Blood of the Lord are radically transformed. Jesus says, “Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day.” (John 6:54) The Eucharist changes us in the most radical way imaginable, from mortal beings subject to death to children of God raised up to new and eternal life.

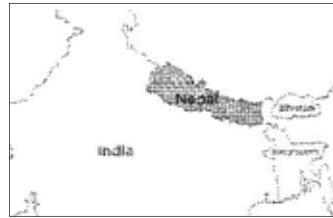
