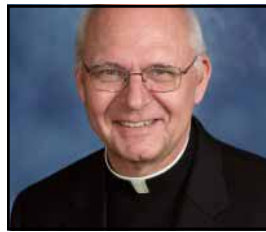

In this way, we believe that the Church is the sacrament of God's saving presence in the world.

## *Reflecting on God's Word*

It is not always easy to be family. Good parents, the old saying goes, give their children roots and wings, a sense of security and freedom to live their lives. But achieving such a balance is often accomplished only after years of working at it. Sometimes children feel smothered by their parents, that they are trying to control their lives; at other times, children feel neglected, that they are not important, even not loved.

The readings today remind us that God wishes us to know that we can find our roots in the divine love of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and that we can also find our freedom there. Paul's words to the Romans pick up first on the purpose of the gift of the Spirit that we celebrated last Sunday. The Spirit has been given us to lead us more deeply into the mystery of God, into the love of God, so that we recognize that we are God's beloved children.

This same message is found in Moses' words to the people as they are about to enter into the Promised Land. Has anyone ever had a God like our God? Moses marvels. Has any God ever shown a people how dear they are by such signs and wonders as our God has shown us? Moses is moving them to know who they are as God's beloved family and to "fix in your heart, that the LORD is God . . . and that there is no other" (Deuteronomy 4:39).

But we are not to stay all curled up in the divine embrace. We have been sent forth to proclaim to others this good news, to "go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). We do this when we allow the Spirit to lead us, to guide us in witnessing to God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

## CATHOLIC Q & A ~ *What Does The Church Teach About The Death Penalty?*



In the wake of the trial of Boston Marathon bomber, Dzhokhar Tsarnaev, resulting in the death penalty, debates have been raised as to whether the US should continue to be the only country in the America's to execute its citizens, and be amongst countries like China, Iran, Saudia Arabia, and Iraq... the countries who have had more executions than the US. The discussion causes us to ask, what the Church teaches about the death penalty.

The Church has taught that there are times when, in order to defend the common good, it may be necessary for the state to take the life of someone who threatens the community. Therefore Scripture, Tradition and the Magisterium all attest that capital punishment can be legitimately accepted in law. However, to leave the discussion there would be to tell only half the story.

In *Evangelium Vitae*, Pope John Paul goes on to explain that there is a "growing tendency" within developed countries to limit and even to abolish the punishment. He explains that the purpose of a punishment is primarily "to redress the disorder caused by the offense". The death penalty should only be used "in cases of absolute necessity." He quotes the Catechism: "If bloodless means are sufficient to defend human lives against an aggressor and to protect public order and the safety of persons, public authority must limit itself to such means, because they better correspond to the concrete conditions of the common good and are more in conformity to the dignity of the human person."

It is now believed that the rehabilitation of criminals can be done without executing them. An article in Our Sunday Visitor concludes that the abolition of the death penalty is a moral imperative, and it is right for Catholics to speak out against the death. Some have argued that the Church has completely reversed its previous teaching. The OSV article insists that this is not the case. Nothing has changed but our ability to secure the imprisonment of criminals. This is why, in *Evangelium Vitae*, St. John Paul can write, "Today ... as a result of steady improvements in the organization of the penal system, such cases [where it is necessary to execute an offender] are very rare, if not practically nonexistent."

Pope Francis has stated, *The arguments opposed to the death penalty are many and well known. The Church stressed some of them opportunely, such as the possibility of the existence of judicial error and the use that totalitarian and dictatorial regimes make of it, which use it as an instrument of suppression of political dissidence or of persecution of religious and cultural minorities, all victims that, for their respective legislations, are "delinquents."*

*Therefore, all Christians and men of good will are called today to fight not only for the abolition of the death penalty, whether legal or illegal, and in all its forms, but also in order to improve the prison conditions, in respect of the human dignity of the persons deprived of freedom.*

When Jesus speaks of his identity and mission as service, he says, "For the son of man came not to be served but to **serve** and to give his life as a ransom for the many." (Mark 10:45) With these words, Jesus not only defined the meaning of his own service and that of all his followers, he also defined the service of those who would act in his name and in his person, the priests of his Church.

We often understand serving as doing favors for others or bestowing benefits on them. For Jesus and for those in Holy Orders—his bishops, priests, and deacons—serving goes much farther and much deeper. He defines his service as "giving his life as a ransom for the many," in other words, his self gift in life-giving love for others. In the end, those in Holy Orders are called to a similar service that culminates in the self gift in life-giving love for others in the Eucharistic sacrifice: *This is my body given up for you. This is my blood.*
