Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On the weekend of June 13–14, 2015, we will take up the annual special collection for the **Retired Priests of the Archdiocese**. Since my first day as Archbishop, meeting the retired priests has been a priority and a joy for me. Presently, there are 204 retirees who continue to share their priestly ministry in our parishes. Each day I hear accolades about their ministerial service. Many parishes depend upon their service for daily and Sunday Masses and for countless funerals. Without the help of our retired priests, many parishes would have to reduce Mass schedules and other services.

Our retired priests rely upon your help now. The Priests' Retirement and Mutual Aid Association (PRMAA) cares for our retired priests. As you know, the costs for health care, prescription drugs, and nursing-home care continue to increase. In addition, the priests' pension fund remains seriously impacted by the economic downturn. This special collection is different from the December collection for retired men and women religious, which goes only to those in religious orders. Archdiocesan priests do not receive any funds from that collection.

As I ask your support of this appeal for our Archdiocesan retired priests, I invite you to think of it not only in terms of a matter of justice to care for their needs, but as an act of solidarity with them, letting our priests know that our appreciation for their witness is so strong that it prompts a desire to join them in their unique contribution to the life of the Church. This appeal gives me the opportunity to share my heartfelt appreciation for the service and devotion of our retired priests. In a special way, we also remember in prayer all the retired priests who have died this year.

Many thanks to all of you for your generosity in this collection last year. Please repeat your kindness during this appeal. Your donations, prayers, and good wishes are a needed support of our retired priests.

Together, let us pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood. At the same time, I offer each of you my pledge of prayers and a remembrance at the Lord's Table. Wishing you every blessing, with kind regards I remain,

Reflecting on God's Word

Going to movies these days can be an immersion in blood. I go to movies fairly regularly and friends in the parish will ask me my reactions now and again. Often over the years, I have found myself responding, "It's well made, but . . . it's pretty bloody." Or "I'm not sure if you want to see all this bloodshed."

It might be surprising to listen to the three readings that all have to do not just with shedding blood, but sprinkling it on people, as Moses did out in the desert, and presenting Jesus as the great high priest who goes into the sanctuary bearing his own blood, which will "cleanse our consciences from dead works" (Hebrews 9:14) so we can worship the living God.

And then there is the more familiar reading of Mark's account of the Last Supper, when Jesus tells his disciples to drink his blood. Perhaps we have gotten used to hearing these words since they are spoken at every Mass. But if you stop and think about it they are rather shocking.

In the biblical world blood is sacred, blood is life. From the beginning animals were offered in sacrifice. But with the offering of the body and blood of Christ, a new relationship has been entered into with our God. Through Jesus' gift of his body and blood, salvation was won for us and is present to us when we gather in his name to praise the Father.

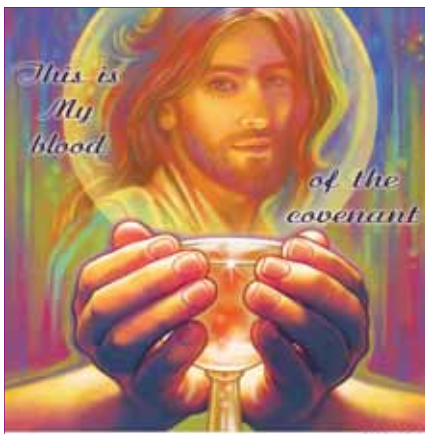

THANKSGIVING

The word "thanksgiving" most often calls to our mind the holiday in November. But as early as the middle of the second century Justin Martyr referred to the blessed bread and wine of the Lord's Supper as "food we call 'thanksgiving'" (in Greek *eucharistia*). The Thanksgiving we celebrate in the autumn is at times marked by a sort of proud societal self-congratulation and the consumption of food until we sink into an inert stupor. The "thanksgiving" that we call our Eucharist is just the opposite: we are led to it by an acknowledgment of our own failings; we remember our humble place in the scheme of things by giving praise to God alone.

While the food of Christ's body and blood fills our spiritual hungers, it also creates in us a greater hunger. We are not sent to our spiritual sofas to let the Lord's Supper settle; we are sent to be living signs of that thanksgiving for the world by looking out for the poor and powerless, feeding the hungry, caring for the sick, speaking out against the self-righteous. In short, the hunger created by our doing in remembrance of Christ must lead us to living in remembrance of him.

CATHOLIC Q & A~ *What is this "Francis Effect" we have been hearing about?*



A journalist who has been covering the Vatican for more than 20 years has never seen anything like the effect Pope Francis is having on the world. John Allen, a journalist for the Boston Globe and its Catholic website called *Crux*, said that he believes "Pope Francis is a man on a mission." He believes there is a miracle at the core of the pope he has become.

As Cardinal Jorge Bergoglio, he rarely made public appearances, gave media interviews or even smiled in public, Allen said. But something changed. After his election as Pope Francis, he described "a mystical experience of God's presence, a sense of interior freedom and peace that has never left him," Allen said.

From that personal perspective and the broader picture Allen sees of the global church, "my gut tells me something extraordinary is going on," he said, adding two years ago some church leaders he spoke with did not think efforts to evangelize "had a fighting chance."

The much-touted "Francis effect" has at this point led more to a greater curiosity in the Catholic Church, more so than in actual church attendance, although half of the pastors in the Diocese of Rome have reported an increase in attendance, Allen said.

If there is an effect, "it doesn't depend on Francis but on us," and the pope's method of Christian outreach and evangelization is a model for all Catholics to follow. "All of us are going to be called into communication on behalf of the church. We have to exude those three qualities (of Francis)," Allen said.

He added that Catholics in their conversations should drop the "prefabricated, boilerplate rhetoric and instead respond heart to heart with a twinkle in your eye."
