

Electronic Fund Transfer (E.F.T.)

Now that the school year has ended and we draw closer and closer to the official summer season, I know that a number of families will be leaving our area and embarking on trips to various destinations. If possible, we encourage you to remain dedicated in your donations to St. Alphonsus Church, even if you are traveling for a specific amount of time.

One great way of continuing your financial support of St. Alphonsus Church while you are gone is our direct-withdrawal **Electronic Fund Transfer (E.F.T.)** program. It is a very convenient and hassle-free way to donate to St. Alphonsus Church without searching for your check book or money every week. If you would like to participate in the E.F.T. program, but still prefer placing an envelope in the collection basket, we will have an area on the envelope where you can mark that you are part of the E.F.T. program.

Here is some information about this program:

Electronic Fund Transfer

Electronic Fund Transfer, (EFT), is the process of automatically having your contribution offering transferred from your checking or saving account to St. Al's account.

What will EFT do for you?

- No more check writing
- No more remembering your envelope
- No more looking for the correct currency
- Automated record keeping

What will EFT do for St. Al's?

- Your offering arrives even when you are not able to attend mass
- You help us simplify our record keeping
- We are better able to plan and budget

If your financial situation changes, you may change or stop your payment at any time by calling the parish office. To sign up for Electronic Fund Transfer, complete the request for an EFT form. Return the completed form by mail or place in the collection basket marked Attn. Office Center. You will be sent an EFT form with more information about the EFT process. Reflecting on God's Word

I watch most of the children in my three brothers' families growing into what is called "emerging adulthood." It must be very difficult at times for parents, only being able to watch, hope, and pray as their children start to move away from home and begin to make their own way into the world. Will they be safe, make the right choices, be happy?

Making use of images from nature, scripture reminds us that God gives the growth, whether it is to mighty cedars springing from small shoots, ripened grain sprouting from the blade, or a fully grown mustard plant emerging from the tiniest of seeds to offer its large branches as housing for the birds.

Such poetic language calls us to reflect on the mystery of the kingdom of God, whose seeds were found in the various covenants extended to Noah, Abraham, Moses, and David, and then fully enfolded in Jesus so many millennia ago. This kingdom continues to sprout in our day, often where least expected.

Sometimes it breaks through like a mighty cedar, but more often it is a quieter blossoming, suddenly emerging like stalks of grain, or the first signs of life carried in a mother's body. I am sure God has worried for all the children of every age who have filled the earth. The kingdom of life won by Christ continues to have the power to carry all God's sons and daughters into the loving arms of the God Jesus taught us to call Father.

IS YOUR CHILD COMING UP WITH TOUGH QUESTIONS?

Do you need to brush up on your faith a bit in order to help your child grow with a good Christian moral foundation? The Alpha Course can help out. Alpha is like a Christianity 101 that addresses the big questions of life such as: Is there more to life than this? Who is Jesus? Why did Jesus die? Why and How do I pray? Why and How should I read the Bible? Who is the Holy Spirit, and what does the Holy Spirit Do? How can I resist evil? Does God heal today?

There are 10 sessions that start with a meal, a 20-minute presentation, and small group discussions on Thursday nights beginning on **June 25th at 6:30pm in the Church Hall**. CATHOLIC Q & A~ *Why do we have a special day to celebrate Corpus Christi, when we celebrate the body & blood of Christ at every Mass?*



St. Juliana of Liege (1193-1258), who from her youth had a great reverence for the Blessed Sacrament, began the cause for the feast day of Corpus Christi. She thought that the Eucharist deserved its own exclusive day of reverence and recognition. This day would be apart from Holy Thursday, when the Church focuses on not only the eucharist but the washing of feet, ordained priesthood, and Jesus in agony in the Garden.. Juliana was motivated by a recurring vision of the Church as a full moon with one dark spot, which she interpreted as the absence of a specific reverence of the Holy Eucharist. She worked more than 40 years for the cause until her death. In the later years of her work, she gained the support of Jacques Pantaleon, at the time Archdeacon of Liege, and other church leaders. Pantaleon was later elected as Pope Urban IV and would go on to establish the feast of Corpus Christi.

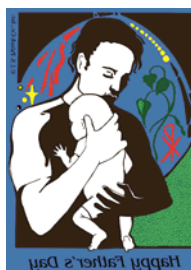

BAPTISM SEMINAR

***Journey of Faith:
Birth, Baptism, Belonging***

If you are expecting a baby, family and friends have showered you with gifts and you have no doubt furnished and decorated a nursery. In the same way your Catholic community, through the sacrament of Baptism, welcomes and offers spiritual strength and encouragement as your child begins a life-long journey of faith.

Our baptismal preparation program, *Journey of Faith: Birth, Baptism, Belonging* is a seminar that will help you better understand the sacrament of Baptism. The seminar can be taken while awaiting the birth of your child or shortly after the baby is born. The seminar will meet on a **Saturday of alternate months** from 9:00 am to Noon in the Religious Education Building. **The Seminar dates for 2015 are: July 11, September 12, November 7.**

If you have not attended a baptismal preparation class at St. Alphonsus in the last three years you must participate in a Baptism seminar. Call the Parish Office at 630-257-2414 to schedule the baptism seminar along with your baptismal date.

The Joy of the Gospel - Evangelii Gaudium - Pope Francis Issued in November of 2013



The Joy of the Gospel is the first Apostolic Exhortation issued by Pope Francis and is devoted to the theme of the New Evangelization.
New Evangelization-what does that mean and what does it mean to St. Alphonsus?

There have been many helpful articles and programs put together to aid believers in how to prepare for and do the things Pope Francis is asking of Spirit-Filled Evangelizers. This article will include excerpts from: Network Education Program, Our Sunday Visitor and American Magazine.

The first thing suggested is preparing the believer for the mission of the church. This is often done through prayer.

- Spend some prayerful time understanding yourself.
 - * Who are you in God? How has God worked actively in your life? When it comes time to tell your story what will you say?
 - * Follow Pope Francis' advice and pray lectio divina.
 - * Pray intentions in personal prayer for people who need Jesus to cross your path
 - * Set aside five minutes a day to pray your gratitude and joy, to avoid becoming a Christian who is like "Lent without Easter." (6)
- Look for opportunities to tell your story
 - * Everyone responds well to stories and particularly stories of personal experience
 - * Continue to find everyday experiences of Jesus' love and compassion in your life to share with others when appropriate
 - * Research shows that one quarter of people in the United States are searching for a deepening of their lives. They are passively scanning the horizon, looking for alternatives. Encountering you could be that alternative for them.
 - * There may be no easy opportunity but as you develop relationships opportunities will present themselves.
- Act and React
 - * Educate yourself about things that are important to you or those you know and love
 - * Respond to Pope Francis' challenge to highlight the relevance of faith communities by getting more involved in your local parish
 - * Become more politically active to impact your community/state/country
 - * Become a more just participant in the economy –see paragraphs 2, 53-56, 60 of The Joy of the Gospel)
 - * Think about your own universal assumptions. Do they need to be reconsidered? Has the world changed? Have you changed? Has your knowledge and experience of God changed?
- Pray
 - * Understand how important prayer, contemplative, lectio divina, adoration, private prayer, prayer groups and do not slight this aspect.
 - * Begin and end with prayer in all things
 - * All efforts should be accompanied with "pray without ceasing!"

Our new Pope is truly a man of the people and a great example for all believers.
Imagine if individual believers and the Church as a whole would follow not only his words and suggestions but his life example!

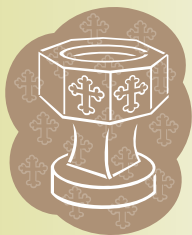

Are You Registered?

Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and to make a commitment in all its dimensions. It also brings many advantages, recognition and responsibility. Being a registered parishioner makes the process much easier when it is time for infant baptism, school registration, weddings, when asked to be a baptismal or confirmation sponsor.

Registering here is very simple. You can go to our web page, www.st-als.org, look under "Parish Registration," and fill out the needed information. You can come into the office and fill out a registration form. If your time is limited, you can take the form home and return it via the collection basket on Sundays or mail it to the office.
