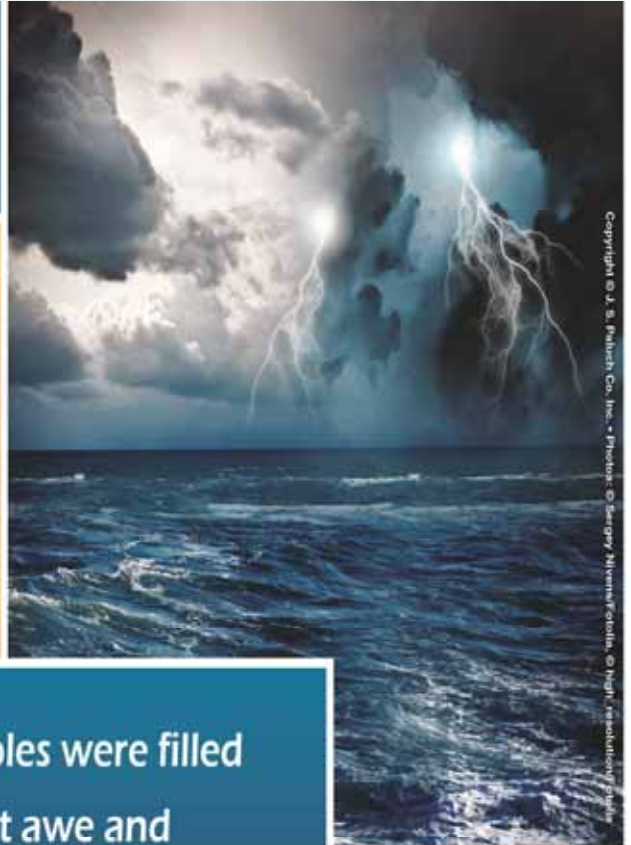

## Reflecting on God's Word

In today's Gospel, Mark says that the invitation to journey to a new and different shore comes from Jesus. He is the one who suggests, "Let us cross to the other side" (Mark 4:35). Yet that invitation comes as evening draws on, as so often happens in life. It comes amid the shadows of life where clarity of action is seldom sharp or distinct. Then to step into the boat is indeed an act of faith. Who would ever choose a crossing at such a time? Yet it was "as evening drew on" that Jesus said to his disciples, "Let us cross to the other side." And so they go.

It is at this point that they take Jesus into their boat, which is always what is expected of the disciple—that the Lord be invited on the journey, and that the journey to the other side be made together. The Jesus story ends in calm and stillness, but that is not its promise. What is assured is that faith can bring one to the other side, which is also the assurance given to Job out of the storm—that it is God who made the thick darkness and put limits on the sea, all along knowing its ability to burst forth. It is God who knows creation and is in control, it is Jesus who knows the human journey and accompanies us, and it is faith that sustains us in the midst of storms.

## CATHOLIC Q & A~ *Why celebrate Father's Day?*

The *Our Sunday Visitor* (OSV) Editorial Board advised that considering the growing body of sociological evidence, we shouldn't view Father's Day as just another syrupy Hallmark remembrance; "it should serve as a clarion call to shore up a vital societal role that increasingly has grown weak, and with disastrous consequences."

Almost a quarter of American children under 18 do not live with their biological father, and that number is growing. At the same time, study after study shows that fathers make an irreplaceable difference in the lives of their children in terms of education, income, abuse, mental and physical health, drug use, sexual activity, pregnancy and other social indicators.

Even fathers who live with their children are challenged these days. It is no secret that fathers take a beating as self-centered buffoons and disengaged know-nothings in popular television and movie representations. The OSV article notes that without a conscious effort to resist pervasive cultural influences, it is too easy for fathers to slip into the same mold.

Sociologists and saints have long said that the love, respect and affection a man shows his wife is among the most valuable conditions a father can create not just for a happy family but also for the formation of loving, emotionally adjusted children.

The formation of children is what fatherhood is all about. OSV contends that it is a duty far too many fathers have drifted away from, whether consciously or through simple inertia and other demands and distractions. Many fathers simply may not reflect on how their example is educating their children: For example, do they model the sarcasm and anger of blogs and cable news, or the dogged but respectful pursuit of truth our Faith demands?

On this Father's Day, we pray that all dads receive the wisdom and strength to fulfill their mission. And we celebrate those fathers who take their role seriously for the good of their families, the Church and society as a whole.

**Are You Registered?**

Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and to make a commitment in all its dimensions. It also brings many advantages, recognition and responsibility. Being a registered parishioner makes the process much easier when it is time for infant baptism, school registration, weddings, or when asked to be a baptismal or confirmation sponsor.

Registering here is very simple. You can go to our web page, [www.st-als.org](http://www.st-als.org), look under “Parish Registration,” and fill out the needed information. You can come into the office and fill out a registration form. If your time is limited, you can take the form home and return it via the collection basket on Sundays or mail it to the office.

A registered parishioner receives all parish mailings. Church law advises that territories or boundaries no longer limit parish registration. We accept anyone who wants to share in the life of our parish regardless of where they live.

Remember that you need to be a registered parishioner to partake in all the services that St. Alphonsus offers. Why not sign up?

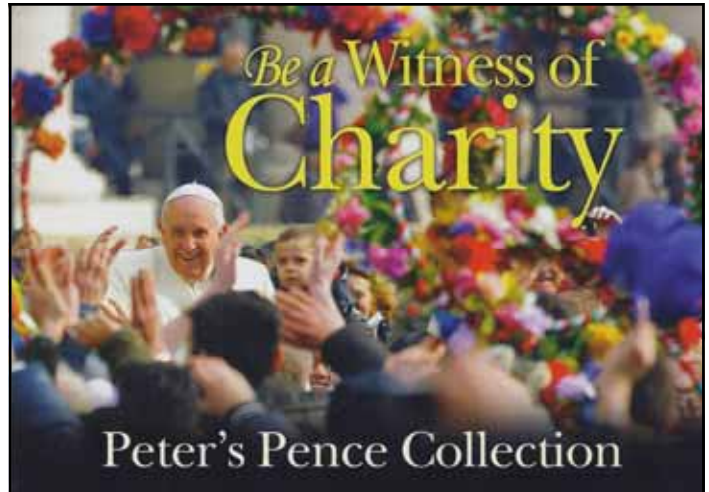
