From Father Brian's Desk

If you were gone on vacation during the summer, you may have noticed that a number of areas of our church property have gone through some improvements these past few months. In June, we removed a number of withered bushes/trees around the church building and the Parish Office and planted some beautiful flowers in their place. We also installed the security camera system around the outside of the church building and inside the church hall. In July, representatives from Extra Electric Energy Solutions replaced a number of our lights in our church hall and parish facilities with energy-efficient bulbs for free. The new bulbs offer a brighter light and they will cut down on our expenses as well.

We were also able to repair and seal the roof of the Religious Education (the old school) building that has been deteriorating due to the extremely cold and rainy weather we have experienced the past few years.

Please be aware that we had to rearrange some parking spaces near the west end of the Religious Education building so that emergency vehicles can have greater access to our church grounds.

I would like to thank everyone in our parish for your continued generosity and patience during these past few months. We are trying our best to make the St. Alphonus Church campus a beautiful and yet, practical area for our parishioners to enjoy.

On this day, Archbishop Carlo Maria Viganò, Apostolic Nuncio to the United States, will invest Archbishop Cupich with the pallium that was blessed by Pope Francis at the Vatican on Monday, June 29.

Archbishop Cupich will greet the faithful in the Cathedral following the Mass until 4:30 p.m.

Reflecting on God's Word

As a boy, I was often sent to Kauder's Bakery on the corner of Preston and Ensor Streets in Baltimore. There was nothing like the variety of breads today, but whether it was white, rye, or Vienna, the smell of fresh-baked bread and especially the crunch of the crust stays with me more than sixty years later.

Kauder's came to mind after reading today's Gospel. Biblical scholars point out that the crowds would have been appalled at Jesus' words: "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you" (John 6:53). The word used for "eat" is a very physical word, the equivalent of munching or chewing. To hear "eat my flesh" would have been repulsive. An invitation to cannibalism! The same with "drink my blood." Jewish law was very clear that no blood should remain in any animal slaughtered for eating. Blood was the "seat of life" and life belonged only to God.

But this is precisely the point. Behind this "sign" is God's wondrous life-giving plan: to bring us into intimate communion when we partake of the very life of the Word made flesh, Jesus Christ. We are not to get drunk on the wine of this world but on the divinized drink of everlasting life. Not mundane manna but the bread that mediates an encounter with the Lord of our salvation. This is truly Wisdom's house, where we eat both the bread of God's word and the bread that is the Lamb of God.



CATHOLIC Q & A ~ Can a practicing Catholic officiate at a civil wedding ceremony?

Assuming that the couple are either non-Catholics not bound by Catholic marital law, that there are no obvious impediments to their marriage (e.g., previous marriage, close blood relationship), and that the Catholic is authorized by the state to officiate at civil wedding ceremonies (e.g., judge, justice of the peace, other recognized official), yes, a Catholic could preside at a civil wedding ceremony. The only caveat would be that a Catholic could not obtain "ordination" from a mail-order or online "ordination" mill, even if his state recognizes marriages performed by individuals who have obtained such "ordinations."

A "NOTE" FROM THE DIRECTOR'S PODIUM



Dear Parishioners and Friends,

With the ending of summer at hand, I once again find myself looking forward to another year of serving you as Director of Music Ministry. It is amazing to realize this is my seventeenth year at St. Alphonsus. I truly feel blest. A "harsh" reality of this, however, is the loneliness I feel when many of our wonderful young adult musicians head back to college or beyond. Many of them have been serving Our Lord with me through music since they were little children. This reality is also what has led me to my "note" to you.

Our Music Ministry is in need of "NEW TALENT!" All choirs and instrument ensembles could use your talents and time. I know there are wonderful voices sitting in the pews because I can hear you! If you enjoy singing as part of your worship, please allow me to find a way for you to share your gift with our parish community. The Instrument Ensemble also needs additional string instruments, flutes, clarinets, and low brass players. If you are at least in the 8th grade with three or more years of training, WE NEED YOU!!! The Instrument Ensemble has always been the most unique facet of our weekly music ministry. I need your help if we are to continue this tradition.

Fr. Brian, the Worship Commission, and I have spoken at length regarding this need. We have initiated a few changes that we hope will make participating in music ministry possible for new members. New this year will be a small choral ensemble at the 11:00 am Mass on a weekly basis. Both singers and instrumentalists are welcome. The music selected for the Liturgy will be a mixture of contemporary with traditional. I am hoping this ensemble will encourage those who prefer attending that Mass to increase their prayerful participation with us. Rehearsals for this choir will coincide with the Parish Choir on Thursday evenings at 7:30 pm. The Children's Choir will continue to rehearse and sing only once each month. We will meet at 3:20 pm on the third Saturday of each month, and prepare the music used at the 5:00 pm Mass that day. Later this fall I will announce a time for (3) one-hour rehearsals for children wishing to sing at the 3:30 pm Mass on Christmas Eve. The Hand Bell Choir will continue to play at the 5:00 pm Mass on the second and fourth Saturdays of the month. Rehearsal times are 6:00-7:15 pm on the Thursdays and 90 minutes prior to an assigned Mass. We welcome children and adults to consider this ministry as well. The Parish choir will be splitting its ministry between the 9:00 am and 11:00 am Mass on the second and fourth Sunday of each month. The Choir will continue to sing at the 9:00 Mass all other Sundays of the month. We are in need of additional volunteer cantors for non-choir Masses. Training will be one-on-one or in small groups. All else in the ministry will remain the same.

The Parish Choir...Open to all parishioners above the age of 13. This Choir serves our parish with all of the weekly and seasonal liturgical worship through music. Music sung by this choir serves to reinforce the weekly scripture. The music ranges from our liturgically sacred past to the most recent sacred contemporary.

The Children's Choir ... Open to children in grades 3-8. Children 7th grade and above may also participate in a Youth Cantor Program.

The Volunteer Cantor Ministry...Providing song leadership to the assembly at all designated liturgies with music. The cantor ministry will also provide small ensemble singing at selected non-choir liturgies.

The Instrumental Ensemble...Open by audition to anyone with at least three years of experience and training on their instrument.

The Handbell Ensemble...Open to all parishioners above the age of 10.

The Resurrection Choir...Open to all parishioners who are generally available any morning for funeral services as they arise. This is a very good ministry for those who cannot make the time commitment to the other parish ensembles.
