

Labor Day Celebration

On this Labor Day weekend, we should take the time to reflect on what this national holiday means to our country. One writer said, "*Labor Day celebrates a yearly national tribute to the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity and well-being of our country.*"

Labor Day originated in 1882 in New York City under the direction of the Knights of Labor. Congress made it a legal holiday in 1894. Labor Day has come to be celebrated by most Americans as the symbolic end of the summer. For many years, the Tuesday after Labor Day was the first day of the school year.

Labor Day also gives us a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the Catholic Church's social teaching on labor such as Pope Leo XIII's 1891 encyclical, Rerum Novarum, and the issue of the condition of the working classes.

Nearly every pope since Leo XIII has issued teachings on the subject of the dignity of the human person, especially in regards to labor. Pope Francis has often spoken about human dignity and what we need to do as Christians and Catholics to make sure it is present in our world. Let us continue to pray for workers around the world and hopefully we can witness an improvement in working conditions and fair wages.

I would like to personally thank everyone who makes St. Alphonus Parish community a wonderful place to worship. I would like to thank the St. Alphonus Parish Staff, the priests who assist us at the weekend liturgies, the liturgical ministers and the countless volunteers who help us in so many ways. Thank you so much for all that you do!

Welcome Guests and Visitors . . . We're so glad that you're here and invite you to join us in thanksgiving for God's action in our lives. Our goal is to provide a spiritual home where all are welcome, where the healing, reconciling, liberating love of God flows through us to all people. In this way, we believe that the Church is the sacrament of God's saving presence in the world.

"Please come to Mass early enough not to disrupt. Leave late enough not to insult (the Mass does not end until the final blessing). Worship reverently enough not to distract. And dress proudly enough not to offend."

Reflecting on God's Word

Perhaps you saw the movie *The King's Speech* about the future king of England, George VI, whose speech impediment was so severe that it reduced him to tears of anger and humiliation. His wife, Elizabeth, found a speech therapist who was able to help him by using some unorthodox methods, such as rolling around on the floor, cursing, and singing. It is a profoundly moving experience when King George finally addresses his people over the radio and delivers a speech flawlessly, giving courage to his people on the eve of World War II.

The story in this Gospel tells us how Jesus helped a man to find his voice. The man whose tongue Jesus touched with his spittle (an element believed to ward off demons) came to speak "plainly." Another word for "plainly" would be "rightly," in the sense of correctly or truly. "Be opened!" Jesus says, and it happens (Mark 7:34). The man then spoke the truth of what Jesus did for him, and honored him.

As we hold firm to our faith in the Lord, Jesus calls us to both speak and act "rightly" in the eyes of the world, caring for those who have little and treating them with the same dignity as those who have much. We are called to imitate Jesus by reaching out tenderly to touch those who have been wounded by life and burdened by the rejection of others. Helping others to hear the sound of love can be done in many quiet ways and with little fanfare.




FEAR NOT

Religious Education Update

REGISTRATION FOR 2015-2016

Sessions start the week of Oct. 4th.

If you are a returning family and have lost your application form, contact the RE Office and we'll send you a replacement. Families who want to register their child for the first time contact the RE Office to set an appointment to register. Visit our website, www.st-als.org, for information on our programs.

Families of children attending non-archdiocesan schools such as Everest Academy, Noonan Academy, or Kingswood Academy who wish to celebrate the sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion, or Confirmation at St. Alphonsus, must be registered parishioners and should contact the RE Office to make your request, and to receive relevant information regarding parent meetings and preparation requirements.

CHILDREN'S CATECHUMENATE

School-aged children who have not been baptized, or in 3rd grade or above and have had no formal religious education are invited to see if this journey in faith is for you. This Children's Initiation Process introduces young people to the person of Jesus and leads them into full membership in his Church. For more information, contact the RE Office.

PRESCHOOL & KINDERGARTEN

We have a special program for children ages 3-5, called *Little Tykes for Christ*. We meet the first Wednesday of the month from 6:15 – 7:15pm from October through April. They will be given examples of how to listen and share their faith in dialogue with their candidates. Parents who missed the parent meeting in May are welcome to learn more about the preparation process and its requirements.

BAPTISM SEMINAR


*Journey of Faith:
