

## *Reflecting on God's Word*

Some people want the Beatitudes to be Jesus' new commandments; others, an eight-step program for dealing with our addiction to this world; and still others, just one more grocery list of what we should be stocking up on for a long winter's journey to the Kingdom. The Beatitudes are also, however, the face of Jesus in its boldest and most daring profile. Every time we catch a glimpse of them in ourselves, it's like looking in the mirror and seeing what we someday will be. The fact is, as St. John attests, it's already begun. I keep bumping into them, and so do you.

I think of someone I know who can't stand division in his home. He is absolutely driven to find healing solutions. He's a peacemaker from the word go. We all know those who are passionate about the weakest among us. They refuse to keep their mouths shut, even at the cost of losing other folks' acceptance. They can't seem to help it. Some seem able to forgive without a second thought. Others honestly and deeply hunger to be holy, not pious or religious but just good. And others seem to enter into people's pain with great compassion and sensitivity in ways that I don't. They actually mourn for the world.

And then there are those of us who don't feel we live many of those Beatitudes very well. Yet every once in a while something pops up from God knows where, and it's a bit of divinity in us that we'd never believed could be there. Then we realize that it must be God's doing because it could never be our own. And if it is God's doing, then we must be God's daughters and sons. What else could it mean? It's like looking in a mirror, and we didn't even know what we were.



## **WE LONG TO SEE GOD'S FACE**

"Lord, this is the people that longs to see your face." This antiphon for today's responsorial psalm offers the focus for today's readings. As we on earth celebrate the triumph of all the saints—the ones officially canonized by the Church, and the countless others who have also reached heaven—we add nothing to their glory. But we give ourselves reason to hope. We too long to see the face of God and believe that we can one day be counted among those whose robes, as John tells us in the book of Revelation, are washed "white in the blood of the Lamb."

The passage from John's First Letter offers further assurance: we are God's children who will one day see God. But today's Gospel pulls us past longing and reassurance into action. Jesus clearly tells us what we must do to be counted among the saints. We must be poor in spirit, hungry for holiness, merciful, single-hearted, and peacemakers! Then we too will see the face of God.

### Tri-Parish Anointing of the Sick Bilingual Mass

On **Saturday, November 14th**, SS. Cyril & Methodius Parish will celebrate the Anointing of the Sick at the **11 AM Mass. This will be a bilingual (English-Polish) Mass.**

We extend an invitation to those in our Tri-Parish Family who feel that the Celebration of Anointing will provide help for them in sickness and aging of their bodies.

In the past, the Anointing was done near the time of death. Theology today understands Anointing as the Sacrament of the sick rather than at the time of approaching death. The Anointing of the Sick is the prayer of Christ and His Church for the physical and spiritual health of the sick person.

#### Who may be Anointed?

- ❖ A sick person may be Anointed before he/she undergoes surgery, whether or not the surgery is serious.
- ❖ Persons with chronic illness.
- ❖ Older persons, even if they are not suffering from dangerous illness.
- ❖ Mentally disabled persons and chemically dependent persons.
- ❖ A sick child may be Anointed in order to be comforted and uplifted by the Sacrament.




### BAPTISM SEMINAR


## Vocations to the Priesthood

**What is it?** ...It refers to the practice of children leaving the Sunday assembly just before the *Liturgy of the Word* and to gather elsewhere to celebrate a

**When & Where?** ...It will take place during the 11 a.m. Mass on Sunday, November 8th and Sunday, November 22nd. Children will be called forward following the Opening Prayer to process out of the worship space to the Church Hall in the lower level of the church. They will return just prior to the Presentation of the Gifts.

**Why?** ... To help make the Mass more meaningful for children; to gradually lead them to full, conscious and active participation in the Sunday liturgical assembly.

**Who?** ... Children in grades K-4. Children younger than this are generally unable to participate consciously and actively in liturgical celebrations. It is not a child-minding event.

Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and to make a commitment in all its dimensions.
