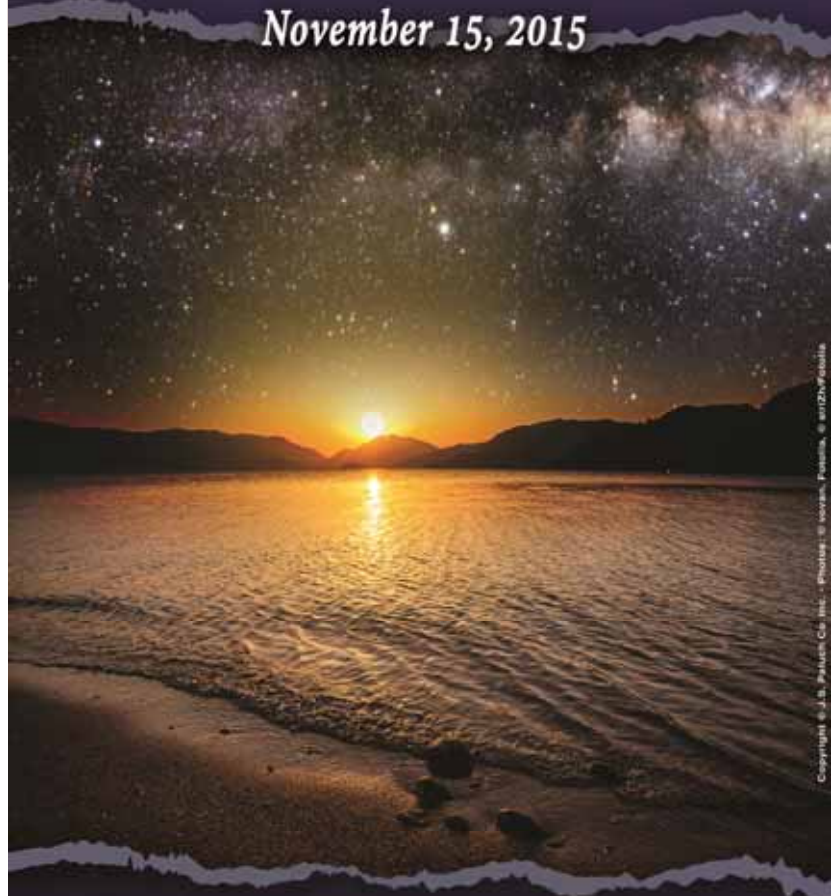

Reflecting on God's Word

Sitting on the Mount of Olives, maybe with a premonition or maybe wondering if all that seemed to be approaching was really the undoing he dreaded, Jesus talked to his disciples about the coming end. He made the point that when worlds change, God comes, which is different from saying that when God comes, worlds change. He talked in poetry of a collapsing world to come.

Collapsing worlds always offer the opportunity to meet God in new and unexpected ways. Our own deaths are undoubtedly the most drastic, but also the death of someone we love, a church in transition, shifting roles for men and women, a computerized age that blips and bleeps across our life screens, and empty-nesting, and retirement, and marrying, and any other cosmic readjustment that you can think of. That's when the Son of Man comes, for the second time or maybe a third or fourth time, and it tends to put us in a fog, as if he were coming in the clouds.

Most of us struggle mightily to keep our worlds from collapsing. We've worked too hard to set them spinning in orbit around our own personal suns. Yet sooner or later they always do collapse, maybe because they lose their momentum, maybe because we lose our energy, or maybe that's just the way it's meant to be. Whatever the reason, those are the moments when our God comes riding into our lives.

WHEN BAD THINGS HAPPEN

We seem to go through cycles when there are a significant number of family illnesses, deaths, and tragedies. In recent weeks we have been going through one of those cycles amongst families in our program. It causes some to ask, if we have such a loving God, then why do people get cancer and die; why are there so many natural disasters, and so much suffering in the world? There just never seems to be an answer that makes any sense or gives any comfort. Our hearts and minds cry out “why” especially when it is our self or a loved one that suffers. We hear about the healing miracles in the gospels, and we all know people who are suffering, and people who need a miracle NOW!

Miracles today seldom come in the same way as they do on the pages of scripture. It can be hard to read about Jesus' miracles without wanting one of our own. In the gospels, we hear Jesus say, “Your faith has saved you” and, “Do not be afraid, just have faith.” Those statements have caused people to wonder over the ages if they have enough faith... deep enough... orthodox enough.

St. Therese of Lisieux reminds us that we are saved by God's love *alone*. When we long for miracles in our lives; to be rescued from suffering, it helps to remember that even Jesus prayed for a miracle on the night before he died. In the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus begged the Father to free him from what was about to happen to him the next day. But the cross remained. Did Jesus lack faith because his prayer seemingly went unanswered? Hardly. Yet, surely a miracle happened that night in the garden. In his praying, Jesus came to understand and accept a purpose for his suffering. He trusted the power of the Father more than he trusted his own. That is a miracle – when we trust that God is God and we are not! In times of uncertainty and distress, “Do not fear, just have faith!” Not in ourselves, but in God alone. 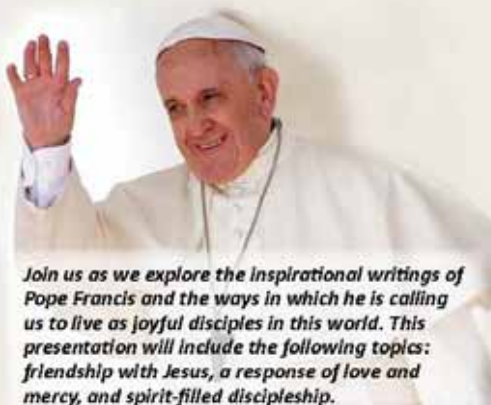

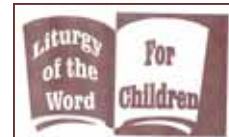

What is it? ...
It refers to the practice of children leaving the Sunday assembly just before the *Liturgy of the Word* and to gather elsewhere to celebrate a separate Liturgy of the Word that is more appropriate to their level of understanding.

When & Where? ...It will take place during the 11 a.m. Mass on Sunday, November 22nd. Children will be called forward following the Opening Prayer to process out of the worship space to the Church Hall in the lower level of the church. They will return just prior to the Presentation of the Gifts.

Who? ... Children in grades K-4. Children younger than this are generally unable to participate consciously and actively in liturgical celebrations. It is not a child-minding event.

EPIPHANY CHRISTMAS SHARING TREE

The Epiphany Christmas Sharing Tree will be in place Thanksgiving weekend, November 28 & 29, the beginning of Advent. During this Advent season, let us remember God's gifts to us and share our blessings with others. We can do this by taking a child's tag from the Epiphany Sharing Tree — **RED** tags for **GIRLS** and **GREEN** tags for **BOYS**. To avoid having one child receive much more than another, please limit the total gift purchase to \$40.00.

When taking a tag, please follow these guidelines:

Each tag has a child's name on it. It is very important that you attach the tag provided with child's name to the gift and **TAPE IT SECURELY TO THE TOP OF THE GIFT**. If you do not tape it on the outside of the gift, a child will not receive his/her gift. Think how disappointing that will be for a child.

GIFT CARDS MUST BE WRAPPED IN A BOX. NO BAGS PLEASE.

RETURN THE GIFT TO CHURCH BY SUNDAY, DECEMBER 13TH.

If donating by check, please make it payable to St. Alphonsus and indicate Epiphany Sharing Tree.
