

### The Journey of Advent

We are now entering the Third Sunday of Advent, "Gaudete Sunday" or "Rejoice Sunday". It reminds us that the joy of Christmas is only a short time away. While many people take down their Christmas decorations after New Year's Day (or even the day after Christmas), the actual Christmas season lasts until the middle of January with the Baptism of the Lord.

# Living God's Word



#### **CELEBRATE**

This Sunday, God rejoices and sings because of us. We read in Zephaniah today that God "will sing joyfully because of you, as one sings at festivals" (Zephaniah 3:18). We know plenty about singing at festivals. Already our ears are ringing with the songs and carols that anticipate the Christmas season.

Paul reminds us of the source of our own double rejoicing: God is the mighty savior who is in our midst (in Zephaniah's words). Because this is so, says Paul, we can rejoice and be at ease. We don't have to worry, for God's peace will stand guard over our hearts and minds.

A medieval carol depicts Christmas as "my dancing day" and urges us to enter into the dance. Why all the merrymaking? Because "the Lord is near," as Paul reminds us (Philippians 4:5). He then points to another reason for the dancing: the dawn of the promise of peace, the peace beyond all understanding, that is now within our grasp.

# **Religious Education Update**

# LAST SESSIONS BEFORE THE BREAK!

After this week, our next sessions will be in 2016 during the week of Jan. 10<sup>th</sup>. Mid-term assessments will be taken this week, and progress reports will be handed out when we return from the break.

## TOP 10 MISTAKES PARENTS OF TEENS MAKE

The Christmas season is one focused on family. Advent is a time where we are introspective. That introspection can include ways that we can improve as parents. The following are suggestions from a blog called *Mere Disciple*. I gave 7 the last 2 weeks, and will give the final 3 this week...

- **3. Outsourcing your teen's spiritual formation.** I see parents assuming that they can completely outsource the spiritual development of their child to parishes and schools. As a parent, YOU are THE key spiritual role model and mentor for your teen. And that isn't "if you want to be" either—that's the way it is. Ultimately, you are charged with teaching and modelling to your teen what follow Jesus means, and while church, youth groups, Christian schools can be a *support* to that end, they are only that: support mechanisms.
- **2.** Not expressing genuine love and like to your teen. It's sad that I have to write this one at all, but I'm convinced very few Christian parents actually express genuine love and "like" to their teen. It can become easy for parents to only see how their teen is irresponsible, failing, immature, etc., and become a harping voice instead of an encouraging, empowering one.

Do you intentionally set aside time to tell your teen how much you love and admire them? Do you write letters of encouragement to them? Do you have "date nights" where you spend time together and share with them the things you see in them that you are proud of?

Your teen won't ask you for it, so don't wait for an invitation. Every day say something encouraging to your teen that builds them up (they get enough criticism as it is!). Pray every day for them and ask God to help you become one of the core people in your teen's life that He uses to affirm them.

#### 1. Expecting your teen to have a devotion to God that you are not cultivating within yourself.

When I talk to parents, it's obvious that they want their teen to have a thriving, dynamic, genuine, life-giving faith. What isn't so clear, however, is whether that parent has one *themselves*. When it comes to the Christian faith, most of the time what we learn is *caught* and not *taught*. This means that even if you have the "right answers" as a parent, if you're own spiritual walk with God is pathetic and stilted, your teen will unconsciously follow suit. While having a healthy and maturing discipleship walk as a parent does not guarantee your teen will follow in your footsteps, expecting your teen to have a maturing faith while you follow Jesus "from a distance" is an enormous mistake.





# **Jubilee Year of Mercy**

December 13, 2015 Third Sunday of Advent

Pope Francis chose to inaugurate the Jubilee Year of Mercy last Tuesday because December 8 marks the fiftieth anniversary of the closing of Vatican II. That council, Pope Francis reminds us, inaugurated a new phase in the Church's history. The Spirit called the Church to tear down the walls that for far too long had made it a fortress, and to proclaim the gospel in a new, more accessible way. Pope Francis quotes Saint John XXIII in declaring the Church's preference for "the medicine of mercy," and Blessed Paul VI in proposing the Good Samaritan as our model for discipleship (Misericordiae Vultus, 4). Pope Francis adds that God's mercy is "the beating heart of the Gospel," and that mercy "must penetrate the heart and mind" of every disciple (MV, 12). Three times today's Gospel asks, "What should I do?" Pope Francis would say: Imitate Jesus, who came not wielding the fiery judgment that John the Baptist had threatened, but instead imparting healing, compassion, forgiveness—mercy!
