Winter Schedule for Saturday Evening Mass

For the last few years a number of parishioners have requested, for safety reasons, if we would consider an earlier Mass time for Saturday evenings during the Winter and Spring months. By doing so this would allow parishioners to arrive at the church while there is still daylight.

After consulting with the Pastoral Staff, it has been decided that we will offer a "Winter Saturday Mass Schedule" beginning on **January 9th, 2016**. St. Alphonsus Church Saturday Evening Mass will change from 5:00 p.m. to **4:00 p.m.** and Confessions will take place at **3:00 p.m.** This schedule will remain until the end of May.

Thank you for your patience. We believe that by offering this Winter Schedule, we are providing some assistance to those who attend our Saturday evening Mass.

Welcome Guests and Visitors . . . We're so glad that you're here and invite you to join us in thanksgiving for God's action in our lives. Our goal is to provide a spiritual home where all are welcome, where the healing, reconciling, liberating love of God flows through us to all people. In this way, we believe that the Church is the sacrament of God's saving presence in the world.

"Please come to Mass early enough not to disrupt. Leave late enough not to insult (the Mass does not end until the final blessing). Worship reverently enough not to distract. And dress proudly enough not to offend."

Reflecting on God's Word

My father used to refer to the town of my—and his—birth as a “nickel-and-dime” town. As a child, I was never exactly sure what he meant, but it didn't sound like a compliment. I think it was similar to Micah's words about Bethlehem as “too small to be among the clans of Judah” (5:1). Another description would be “backwater.” Hardly a place deserving of great expectations. Yet backwater Bethlehem, city of David the shepherd boy, was to be the birthplace of the Messiah—not Jerusalem, center of government and religion, city of David the warrior king.

God's strange choices extend beyond geographical sites to the people on whom God sets eyes. A young betrothed girl up in the north, a barren woman down in the south—these were chosen to play pivotal roles in the story of salvation. The once-barren Elizabeth, soon to bring forth the greatest of all prophets, now proclaims God's most marvelous work and the little one through whom God is working: “Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb” (Luke 1:42).

Elizabeth cues us to join in the response of the baby in her womb: to allow our hearts and spirits to leap for joy. Again and again God works through those who are open to the Spirit. Blessed are they who place their trust in the Lord, who continues to come to give us new life.

A NEW ORDER

“O, Little Town of Bethlehem.” A Philadelphia clergyman named Phillips Brooks penned these popular words back in the mid-1800s, but the prophet Micah could have used them first. Micah knew that from small packages great treasures come. In today's first reading, he knew that from tiny Bethlehem would come the Lord.

The writer in Hebrews explains that Christ came to us to do the will of God by establishing a new order and by becoming our perfect sacrifice. And Luke tells us that Elizabeth and John, the infant in her womb, understand that great and wondrous things are at hand with the coming of the Lord.

This is the Fourth Sunday of Advent. Soon we celebrate anew the fruit of Mary's womb. As we are told in Hebrews, Jesus' new order is being established even today. And as Micah proclaims, his greatness is reaching even now to the ends of the earth.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

A Blessed Christmas to you all.

My greeting comes at a time marked by sad and troubling news for our city, our nation and our world. The joyful news of Christmas competes in these days with stories of street violence in our city, of wars, conflicts and acts of terrorism throughout the world including in our own nation.

As people of faith, we must read these “signs of the times.” As we do, so Christmas gives us a proper perspective: the sadness of violence and war does not have the last word. God has come to save us, for we cannot save ourselves. The savior born to us raises us up from darkness and brings us into his own wonderful light.

One of the Christmas readings taken from Paul’s letter to Titus says this:

*When the kindness and generous love of
God our savior appeared,
not because of any righteous deeds we had done but
because of his mercy,
he saved us... Titus 3:4-5*

We hear those words “because of his mercy,” especially as we celebrate the Jubilee of Mercy this year. The challenge for us is not just to believe that God is merciful, but also to believe that God is merciful to us and that God is blessing us with his mercy precisely at this very moment, and in the limited circumstances of our lives and relationships. When we accept that mercy, we will be transformed and become the merciful light of God in a dark and cold world. Then, our own works of mercy will, in turn, bring hope, healing, and renewal, just as God’s mercy has done for us.

May God bless you and your families with his mercy and enable you to be the hands of his mercy in our world.

Jubilee Year of Mercy December 20, 2015 Fourth Sunday of Advent

In proclaiming the *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pope Francis proclaimed his desire that this Holy Year be "steeped in mercy," as we disciples "go out to every man and woman," bringing the "balm of mercy" to "believers and those far away, as a sign that the Kingdom of God is already present in our midst!" (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 5). In her visitation of Elizabeth, Mary beautifully presents just such an image. Despite the perils of her pregnancy, not to mention her preoccupations as a young unwed mother, Mary instantly, unselfishly, "goes out" of herself, hastening far and over dangerous terrain, to "bring the balm of God's tender mercy" in assistance rendered to her older relative. Since baptism and the Eucharist have made us, in a way, bearers of the living Christ within as Mary was, such selfless "going out" of ourselves to be of loving service to others in mercy should especially mark our Christmas season this Jubilee Year.

BAPTISM SEMINAR

Journey of Faith: Birth, Baptism, Belonging

If you are expecting a baby, family and friends have showered you with gifts and you have no doubt furnished and decorated a nursery. In the same way your Catholic community, through the sacrament of Baptism, welcomes and offers spiritual strength and encouragement as your child begins a life-long journey of faith.

Our baptismal preparation program, *Journey of Faith: Birth, Baptism, Belonging*, is a seminar that will help you better understand the sacrament of Baptism. The seminar can be taken while awaiting the birth of your child or shortly after the baby is born. The seminar will meet on a **Saturday of alternate months** from **9:00 am to Noon in the Religious Education Building**. **The Seminar dates for 2016 are: January 9th, March 12th, May 7th, July 9th, September 10th and November 12th.** If you have not attended a baptismal preparation class at St. Alphonsus in the last three years you must participate in a Baptism seminar. Call the Parish Office at 630-257-2414 to schedule the baptism seminar along with your baptismal date.

OPEN ENROLLMENT FOR ST. PATRICK'S SPRED GROUP 6-10

St. Patrick's Parish has open enrollment in their SPRED Program for special needs children ages 6-10.

SPRED is a program of religious education specifically designed to meet the spiritual needs of persons with developmental disabilities. Through the participation in a SPRED community of faith and experience of friendships on a one-to-one relationship, our friends are better able to celebrate the sacraments and enter into the worshipping experience of the whole Church.

SPRED Community Sessions are scheduled to begin in February, 2016 and will be held every other Thursday from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. The Community Sessions will be held at St. Pat's ministry building located on Cass Street adjacent to St. Patrick's Church (200 East Illinois Street, Lemont, Illinois).
