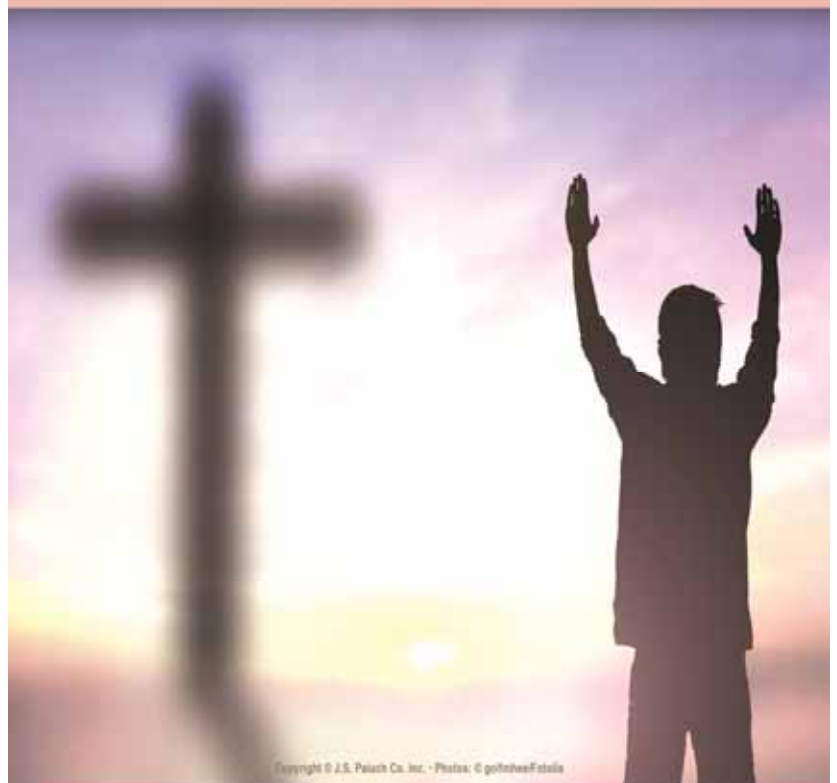

From Father Brian's Desk

Ash Wednesday

Even though it may seem that we just celebrated Christmas, it can be pretty shocking for many people that Lent actually begins this week! Our preparation for the season of Lent begins on Tuesday morning, Feb. 9th, with our ritual "*Burning of the Palms*" immediately following the 7:30 a.m. Mass.

Those who have brought their Palm branches from last year's Palm Sunday can place them in the fire and witness as they turn into the ashes we will use the next day, Ash Wednesday. Following the "*Burning of the Palms*", please join us in the Church Hall for some refreshments as we celebrate a nice breakfast before the Ash Wednesday fast.

As we are all aware, Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday**. Our Ash Wednesday schedule is: **7:30 a.m. Mass, 12:30 Prayer Service, 3:30 p.m. Prayer Service and 7:00 p.m. Mass.**

Throughout the season of Lent, we will have a number of opportunities to pray, especially through the 7:30 a.m. Daily Mass in the Church, Stations of the Cross on Fridays during Lent, our Lenten Songs for the Soul on Feb. 14th and our Tri-Parish Reconciliation on Monday, March 21st at Ss. Cyril & Methodius. Please join us as we allow the Holy Spirit to guide us for the forty days of sacrifice, forgiveness and love.

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY!

"Holy, holy, holy!" Ancient languages, like the Hebrew used in the scriptures, did not always have a way to express superlatives in one word. Isaiah could not say God was "holiest," so he used the threefold repetition of the same word. This bit of scriptural minutiae about these "three little words" that we sing at every Mass serves as a reminder that answering God's call has to be grounded in awareness of God's holiness. In Isaiah and in the Gospel passage today, we hear accounts of the revelation of God's power and might: the seraphim in the temple and the miraculous catch of fish. These are not wondrous revelations for their own sakes. They lead to a response in mission, Isaiah's "Here I am, send me!" and the disciples' leaving everything to follow Jesus. And so must our own "Holy, Holy, Holy!" lead us to Christ in the Eucharist every Sunday, and to a life following him day by day.

Abstinence from meat is required on Ash Wednesday day and on all Fridays of Lent for Catholics 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are also days of fasting. It is required for all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59, to eat only one full meal on these days, and other foods as necessary to maintain their strength.

Jubilee Year of Mercy
February 7, 2016
Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

During this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pope Francis calls us to share with everyone the tender compassion of God that we ourselves have experienced. In today's Gospel, Luke uses a special Greek word conveying just such tenderness. In the other Gospels, Jesus calls the disciples to be "fishers," *haleis*, the same word that means catching fish with hooks or nets, to be killed and eaten. But Luke uses *zogron*, from *zoe* or "life," meaning "catch or gather people alive," as animal lovers capture without harming, rescue from "the wild" for a better life, and protect in aquarium or zoo, tenderly cared for by professionals committed to the creatures' well-being. So in Luke's vision—and Pope Francis' as well—we who have been "caught alive" by God's mercy ourselves are to become "missionaries of mercy" during this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, rescuing fellow sinners from danger and gathering them into Jesus' community to enjoy fullness of life.

What is it? ...

It refers to the practice of children leaving the Sunday assembly just before the *Liturgy of the Word* and to gather elsewhere to celebrate a separate Liturgy of the Word that is more appropriate to their level of understanding.

When & Where? ...It will take place during the 11 a.m. Mass on Sunday, February 14 & February 28. They will return just prior to the Presentation of the Gifts.

Who? ... Children in grades K-4. Children younger than this are generally unable to participate consciously and actively in liturgical celebrations. It is not a child-minding event.


Why? ... To help make the Mass more meaningful for children; to gradually lead them to full, conscious and active participation in the Sunday liturgical assembly.

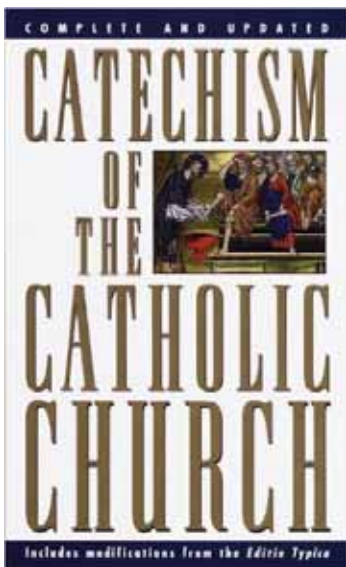

Are You Registered?

Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and to make a commitment in all its dimensions. It also brings many advantages, recognition and responsibility. Being a registered parishioner makes the process much easier when it is time for infant baptism, school registration, weddings, or when asked to be a baptismal or confirmation sponsor.

Registering here is very simple. You can go to our web page, www.st-als.org, look under "Parish Registration," and fill out the needed information. You can come into the office and fill out a registration form. If your time is limited, you can take the form home and return it via the collection basket on Sundays or mail it to the office.

A registered parishioner receives all parish mailings. Church law advises that territories or boundaries no longer limit parish registration. We accept anyone who wants to share in the life of our parish regardless of where they live.

Remember that you need to be a registered parishioner to partake in all the services that St. Alphonsus offers. Why not sign up? You are surely welcome!
