Abstinence from meat is required on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent for Catholics 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are also days of fasting. It is required for all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59, to eat only one full meal on these days, and other foods as necessary to maintain their strength.

IT'S LENT! ... WHAT ARE WE TO DO?!

Lent is a time where we become more intentional, less concerned about ourselves, and more willing to reach out to others. It may involve stepping out of our comfort zones, but that's not usually a bad thing. Forty days is the perfect amount of time to form good habits that may stick with you for the rest of your life.

So why not make this Lent a time to bring your family closer together? Whether you've got toddlers, teenagers, or everyone in between, it's never too late to start something new.

I'm going to offer a few simple things each week that you can do with your family to make this Lent more meaningful, and bring you a little closer together.

Read the daily scripture readings at breakfast. Why not read the Gospel out loud why your children are finishing their cereal or buttering their toast? A great free app with the daily readings and reflections is Laudate.

Cut down your grocery bill. If you find yourself spending \$300 during a usual grocery shop, take out a few things and try to keep it under \$200. You can donate the money you saved to a local charity. Choosing to eat simpler meals is a great way to relate with the poor.

Pray together in the evening. Taking the time to pray as a family is one of the best gifts you can give to your children. It might be difficult at first, but find a time that works for you and stick with it. Don't get discouraged if you miss a few nights. Lent is a great time to try, fail, and try again. Don't be afraid to start small, even if it's just an Our Father and a prayer for grandma and grandpa. Let your kids take turns leading the prayer times and see if they could do a little faith sharing on something they read, or heard or learned that day.

Jubilee Year of Mercy
February 14, 2016
First Sunday of Lent

On Ash Wednesday Pope Francis commissioned “Missionaries of Mercy,” priest-confessors sent forth worldwide as “living signs of the Father’s readiness to welcome those in search of [God’s] pardon.” In a way, though, Pope Francis challenges all of us to become “missionaries of mercy” (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 18) by living Lent in this *Jubilee Year of Mercy* “more intensely as a privileged moment to celebrate and experience God’s mercy” (*MV*, 17). Francis bids us make the prophet Micah’s words our own: “God . . . who does not persist in anger forever, but delights rather in clemency. You will cast into the depths of the sea all our sins” (Micah 7:18, 19). Having experienced God’s mercy ourselves in the unconditional forgiveness of our sins, how eager we should be to invite others to know the peace of God’s boundless mercy; perhaps even to experience, through our reaching out in gentle kindness and compassionate care, something of God’s unconditional love for them.

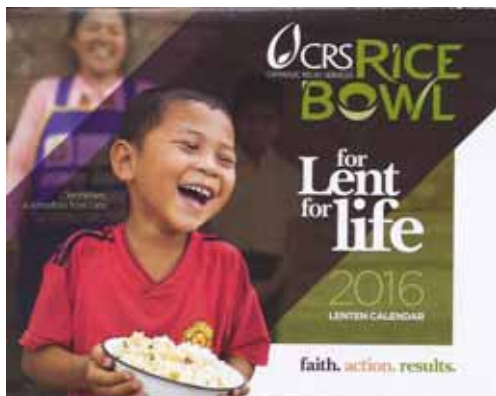

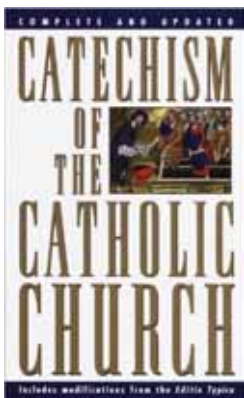

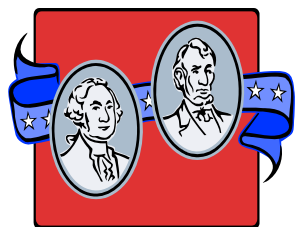
