2016 Confirmation Class

Last weekend, our 8th graders and their sponsors attended the 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Masses and they received a blessing from the church community as they continue on their journey to the Sacrament of Confirmation. They have prepared a great deal during the past year to make it to this point in their journey of faith.

Some of the programs they have completed include: choosing a Confirmation name, a report on their favorite Catholic Saint, "What I want to be Confirmed" and completing over 40 hours of service in the area of school, community, church and at home.

They will participate in the Confirmation Retreat **Fr. Tomby McCarthy** on Sunday, March 6th which they will reflect on Confirmation and how they will be considered in the eyes of the Catholic Church. They will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation **Bishop Francis Kane** on Saturday, March 19th at 2:00 p.m.

Saturday Mass at 5:00 p.m. on March 19th (One Night Only!)

A number of people have approached me and commented how they enjoy the Saturday Mass being celebrated at 4:00 p.m. **However**, on day, March 19th, we have to change the time for Saturday Mass from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. because the Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled for 4:00 p.m. and it probably won't conclude until 4:00 p.m.. By moving the Saturday Mass to 5:00 p.m. it will give enough time for the 8th graders and their families to depart after the Confirmation liturgy.

Religious Education Update

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN ... 6TH GRADE

In recent weeks, our 6th graders have been learning about Catholic Moral teaching, and entered into discussions on how true joy is attained by living a moral life and believing in the hope of eternal life. One of the Core Objectives at the 6th grade level is to be able to demonstrate ways you can live a life of holiness. Mrs. Ferguson's class looked at the Beatitudes and discussed how these are directions from God on how to live a life of holiness and happiness. Students gave examples of ways that they can live the Beatitudes. Parents were encouraged to ask their children about this and encourage them to continue to follow these guidelines.

One of the ways Mrs. Ferguson's class is living out the Beatitudes is by running a food/basic necessity drive on the Wednesday evening RE classes. The students formed groups, picked one class to be in charge of, and created flyers to hand out to the class. They have been collecting donations from classrooms, and have been invited to participate in delivering them to the Lemont Food Pantries.

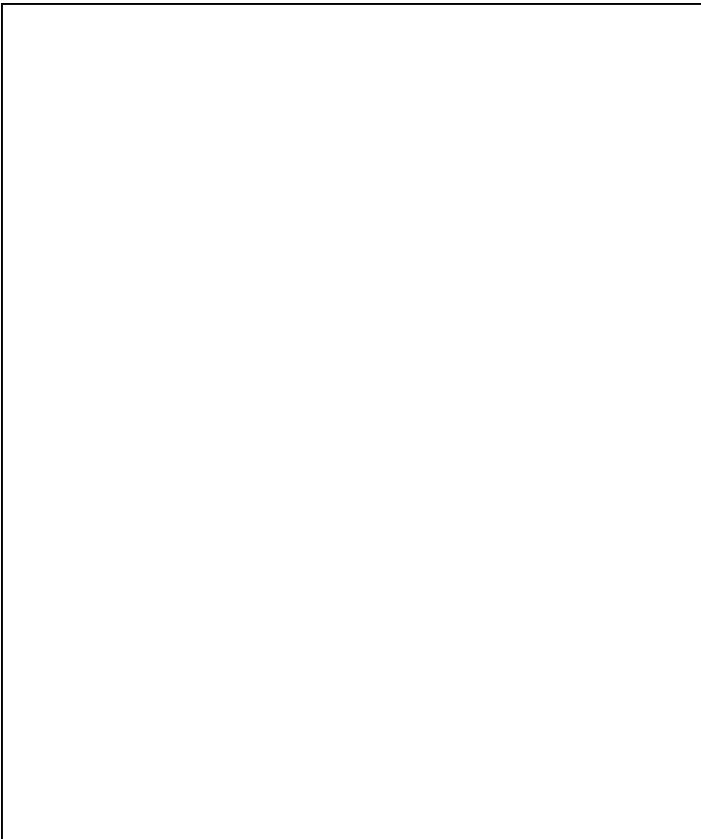

What is it?

It refers to the practice of children leaving the Sunday assembly just before the *Liturgy of the Word* and to gather elsewhere to celebrate a separate Liturgy of the Word that is more appropriate their level of understanding.

When & Where? It will take place during the 11 a.m. Mass on Sunday, March 6th. Children will be called forward following the Opening Prayer to process out of the worship space to the Church Hall in the lower level of the church. They will return just prior to the Presentation of the Gifts.

Who? Children in grades K-4. Children younger than this are generally unable to participate consciously and actively in liturgical celebrations. It is not a child-minding event.

Why? To help make the Mass more meaningful for children; to gradually lead them to full, conscious and active participation in the Sunday liturgical assembly.

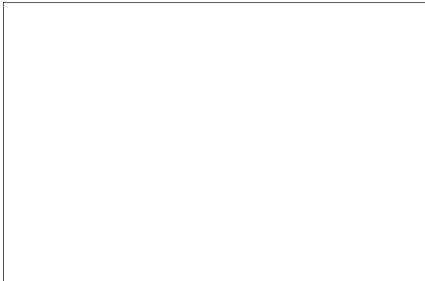
