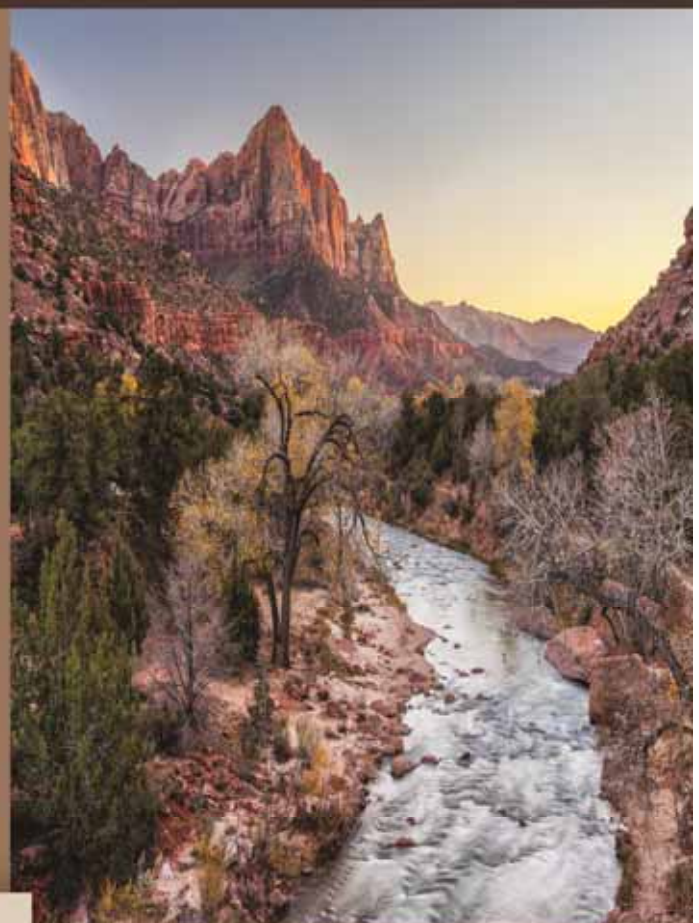

### Tri-Parish Lenten Mission

Our Tri-Parish Lenten Mission will take place **March 14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>** at **St. Patrick Church**. Each presentation will begin at 7:30 p.m.. Our Mission Guide this year will be **Monsignor John Canary** and the topic is **"Embracing the Cross with Love and Mercy"**.

Monsignor Canary is the former Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Chicago and Rector of Mundelein Seminary. He also has offered motivating presentations on St. John of the Cross. Please join us for three inspirational nights about our faith and how we are able to follow in the footsteps of Jesus.

It is our hope that the 72 short videos and discussions have made a difference that will lead our young people to making a lifetime commitment to the Catholic faith. ## Jubilee Year of Mercy

### March 13, 2016

### Fifth Sunday of Lent

How fitting that the first Sunday Angelus of Pope Francis, who has made mercy his papacy's theme, took place in today's Gospel about Jesus' encounter with the adulterous woman. "Jesus' attitude is striking," Francis declared. "We do not hear words of scorn or condemnation, only words of love, of mercy, an invitation to conversion: 'Neither do I condemn you' " (John 8:11). Francis continued: "God's face is the face of a merciful father who is always patient. Have you thought about God's patience, the patience [God] has with each one of us? That is [God's] mercy. [God] always has patience, patience with us . . . understands us . . . waits for us . . . does not tire of forgiving us" if we return 'with a contrite heart' (Pope Francis, Angelus address, March 17, 2013). Parishes preparing catechumens may proclaim Jesus' raising of Lazarus. Referring to Lazarus, and all those "raised" from the "death" of sin, Jesus defines the community's "mission of mercy"— "Untie him and let him go" (John 11:44).

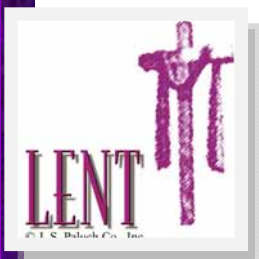

The book of Acts shows the Church, enlivened by the Holy Spirit, teaching, preaching, healing, and restoring outcasts in the same way that Jesus did on earth.

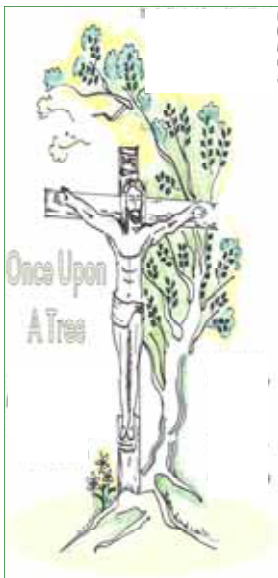
The Acts of the Apostles provides an historic framework for understanding the rest of the New Testament. Paul's letters in particular come alive in a new
