From Father Brian's Desk

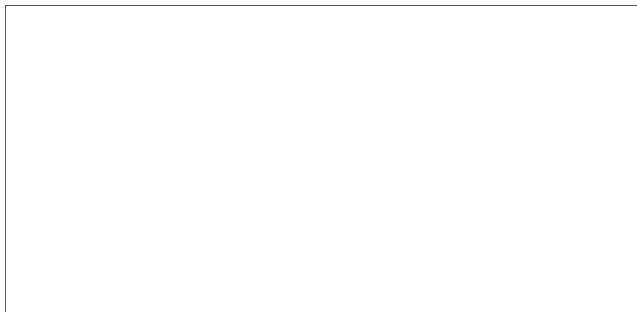

Reflecting on God's Word

Most of us find ourselves remembering a mixture of both good and bad times. We are able to call up the blessing of those times when we lie back on the grass, hands behind our heads, gazing at clouds and dreaming of how they shape themselves into silhouettes of what we've known and loved. We hang on to such times.

But other memories come along as well, clouds drearier if not also stormier. Adolescence, maybe it can still ring a copper penny. Or the growing relationship we once had with a parent still limp from it, a bruised or broken spirit that never healed the way it should have. Or the team that comes from never having made the team, not the basketball team or love's team or even life's team. We go on in the wrong bus when everyone left for the game, never after we gaze through the window at all the other buses who never wave back.

Mercifully life moves on. And if we're blessed, it moves on in goodnesses of other sorts. Yet not without the scars of those ways our flesh has of remembering. In some ways they're buoys that mark the deep-water channel in the river of life, markers for safe sailing as well as for rocky beds that rip us open.

So we remember the wounds, which is what Thomas said they were. They also marked the real Jesus. He knew that if the wounds into which he would put were real, so would Jesus be, and so also the demise of death. For Thomas it was the wounds that proved the resurrection and so moved him into faith.

What will help you to believe? Today's readings tell of faith and doubt. They offer stories recorded to help us believe, as the passage from John's Gospel (20:31) remarks today. There is an urgency about this. On this Second Sunday of Easter we are challenged to join the company of believers: countless men and women who witnessed the power of the apostles' faith.

There is no doubt that this power comes from Jesus Christ. The second reading, from the book of Revelation, reports a mystical vision of the Son of Man, who proclaims, "Once I was dead, but now I am alive" (Revelation 1:18). The Gospel gathers everyone but Thomas to see the Risen and receive the Holy Spirit from him. Like Thomas, we who have come along must have faith so that we can have life.

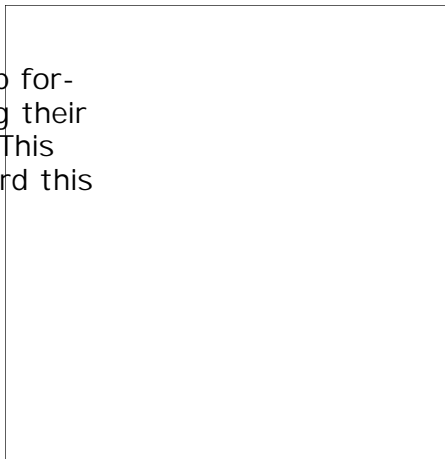


MEET A NEW CATECHIST

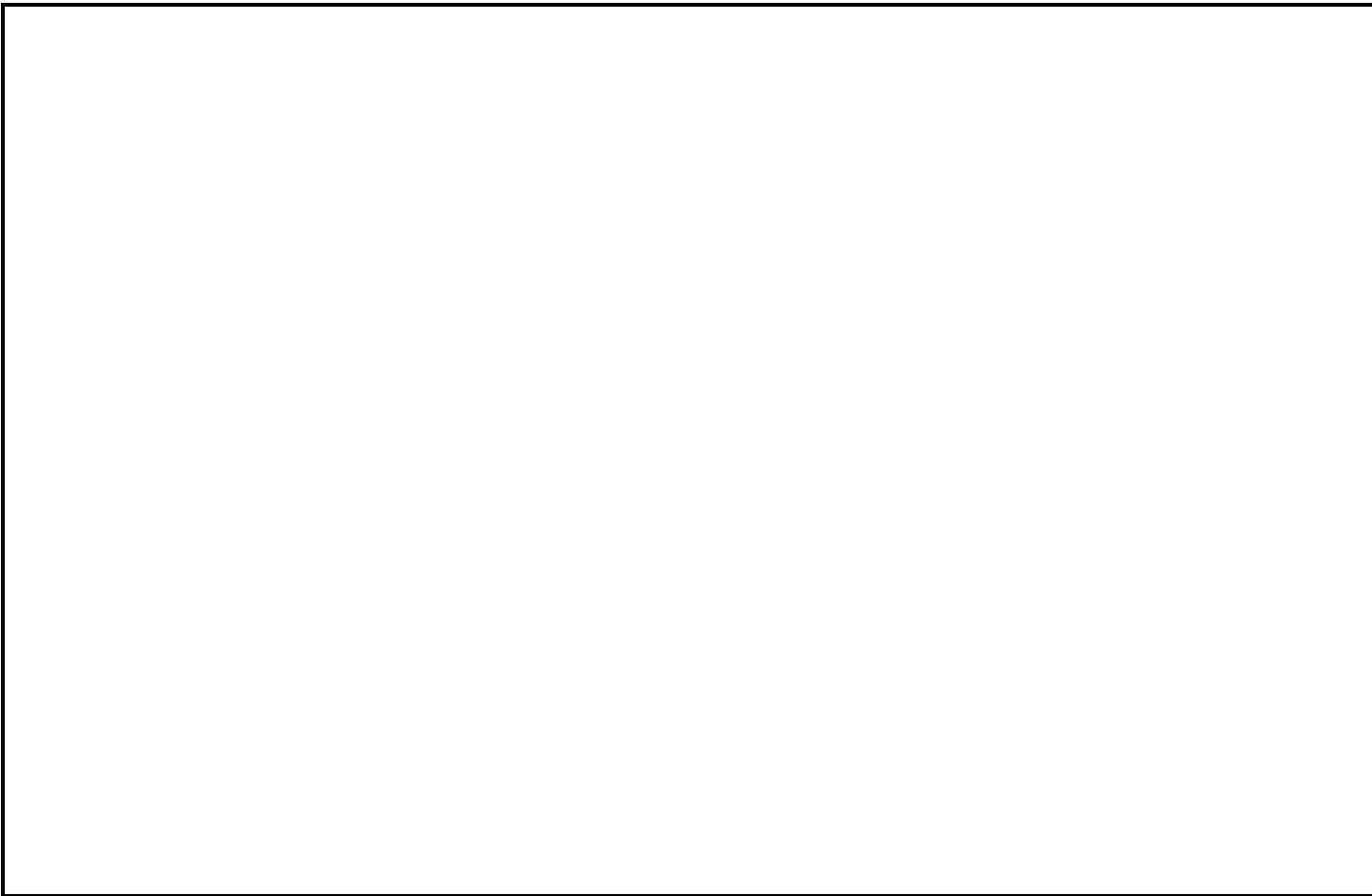

Jubilee Year of Mercy
April 3, 2016
Second Sunday of Easter or
Sunday of Divine Mercy

Last year on this Sunday, Pope Francis declared this year a Jubilee Year of Mercy. Saint John Paul II named the Second Sunday of Easter Sunday of Divine Mercy in response to Saint Faustina's Divine Mercy devotion, which offered spiritual comfort to hearts worldwide. But Francis challenges us to make that comfort receive a gift we gladly share: We are called to show mercy because mercy has first been shown to us. The clearest expression of merciful love, says Francis, is pardoning others. At times how hard it seems to forgive! he acknowledges. And yet pardon is the instrument placed into our fragile hands to attain serenity of heart (Misericordiae Vultus, 9). The necessary condition for living joyfully? To let go of anger, wrath, violence, and revenge. May Divine Mercy Sunday in this Jubilee Year of Mercy remind us that Jesus made mercy our life ideal and a criterion for our faith's credibility: Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy (Matthew 5:7).

What is it?

It refers to the practice of children leaving the Sunday assembly just before the Liturgy of the Word and to gather elsewhere to celebrate a

separate Liturgy of the Word that is more appropriate to their level of understanding.

When & Where? It will take place during the 11 a.m. Mass on Sunday, April 10. Children will be called forward following the Opening Prayer to process out of the worship space to the Church Hall in the lower level of the church. They will return just prior to the Presentation of the Gifts.

Who? Children in grades K-4. Children younger than this are generally unable to participate consciously and actively in liturgical celebrations. It is not a child-minding event.

Why? To help make the Mass more meaningful for children; to gradually lead them to full, conscious and active participation in the Sunday liturgical assembly.

Girl Scouts of Troop 70929 are asking for help gathering items needed March 19th thru April 29th to make Socks of Love as a service project to assist the homeless

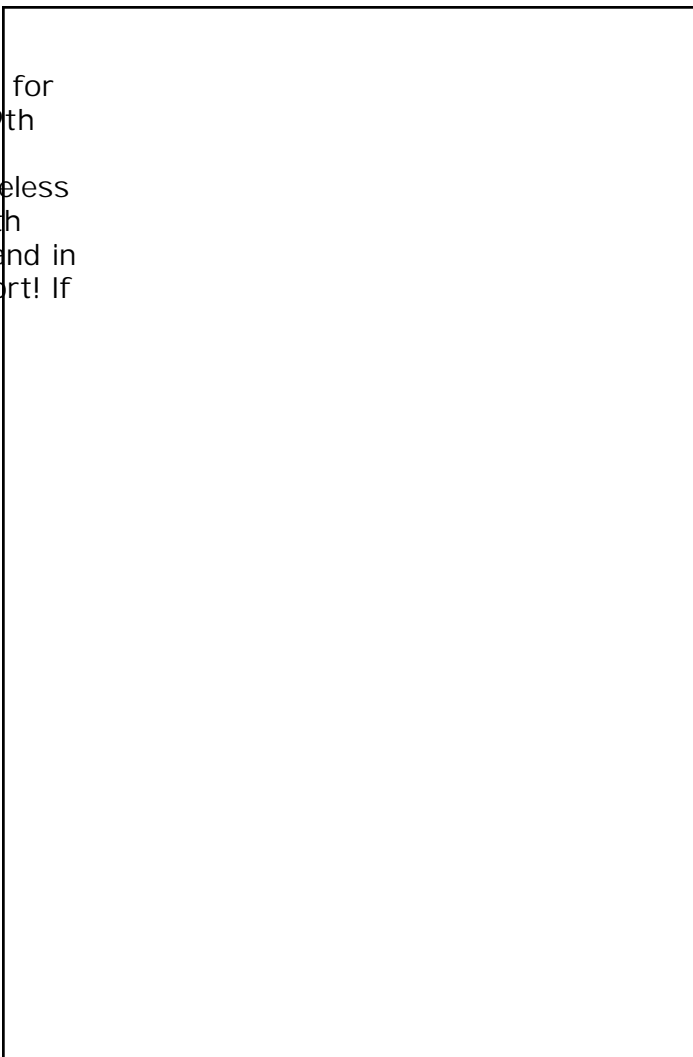

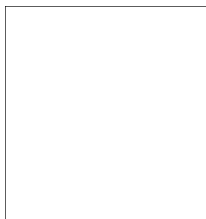

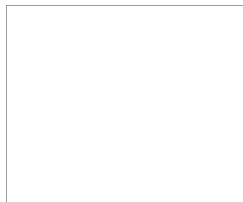
