

Tri-Parish Weekday Morning Mass

In keeping with the tradition that began a few years ago, the Catholic Communities of St. Alphonsus, Ss. Cyril & Methodius and St. Patrick will move to a Tri-Parish Weekday Morning Mass schedule starting Wednesday, June 1st and concluding on August 31st.

One parish will serve as the "host parish" for the 7:30 a.m. Morning Mass (Monday – Saturday). The Mass intentions will be collected from each parish and celebrated together by the priest assigned to that specific Mass. St. Alphonsus Church will host the first month of the Tri-Parish Weekday Masses in the church beginning on **Wednesday**, **June 1st** and concluding on *Thursday, June 30th.* From there the Tri-Parish Mass will travel to St. Patrick Church for the month of July and then move to Ss. Cyril and Methodius for the month of August. The complete summer schedule will continue to be posted in the bulletin for the next few weeks.

But we who have been clothed and anointed with the Spirit don't need anything else.



CONTINUALLY PRAISING GOD

In both the first reading and the Gospel we are told about Christ's glorious ascension into heaven. Paul's letter to the Ephesians reminds us that Christ has been seated at God's right hand in heaven, above every choir of angels. There might be a temptation to stay at an awed distance from Jesus Christ. However, the tone of today's readings is far from that temptation. The tone is exultant and the message is urgent. We are to be his witnesses, and the Gospel describes the first witnesses this way: "[W]ith great joy . . . they were continually in the temple praising God" (Luke 24:53).

How can we continually praise God? The answer can be found in the second reading, in which Paul prays that God will give us a "Spirit of wisdom and revelation" in order to know Christ clearly (Ephesians 1:17). We cannot stand at a distance. We are to be enlightened and empowered.

WHAT OUR CATECHISTS LIKED (Part 2)




Students Enjoy Gala Prizes



Jubilee Year of Mercy May 8, 2016 The Ascension of the Lord

As the liturgical year—and this *Jubilee Year of Mercy* unfold, we reflect on what Jesus' ascension meant for the first disciples and means now for us. Stay in Jerusalem, Jesus had instructed, awaiting "the promise of the Father. In a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit. You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:4-5, 8). Despite Jesus' absence, they wait "with great joy . . . continually in the temple praising God" (Luke 24:52–53). But as we join them, waiting and worshiping, the enduring challenge—theirs and ours—is delivered by "two men in white" (Acts 1:10). In every age, disciples must stop looking at the sky, head down the mountain, and go back into the world, "commissioned," says Pope Francis, "to announce the mercy of God, the beating heart of the Gospel," inviting everyone to find "in our parishes, communities, associations and movements . . . wherever there are Christians . . . an oasis of Mercy" (Misericordiae Vultus, 12).
