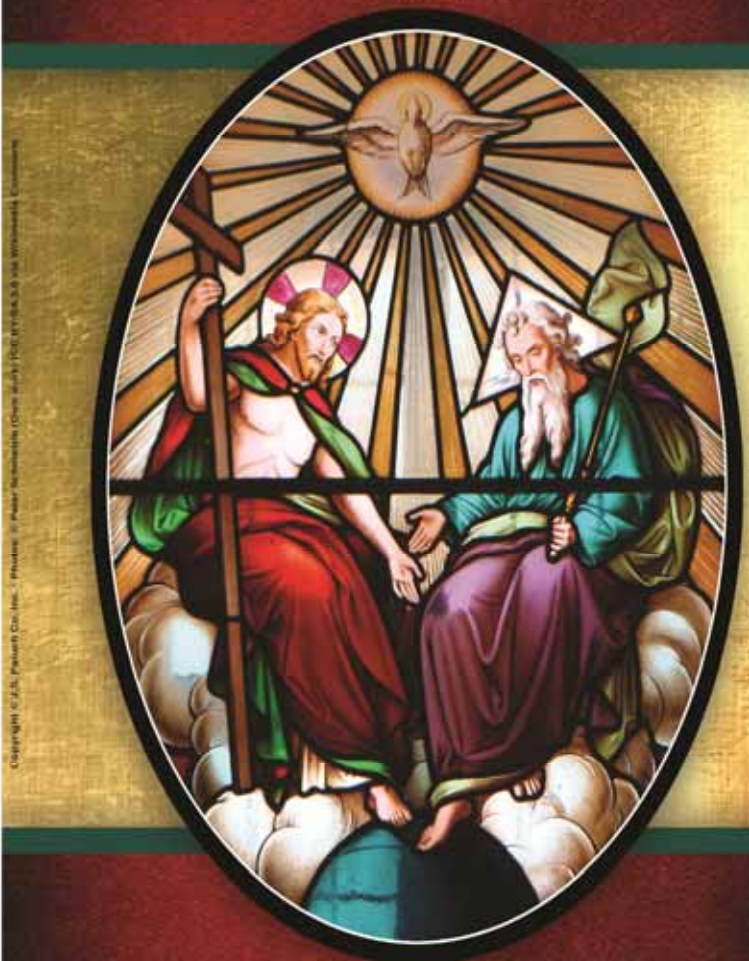

### Priesthood Anniversaries

May is the month in which many priesthood ordinations have been celebrated. On Saturday, May 21<sup>st</sup>, the Archdiocese of Chicago welcomed 5 new priests to ministry. They will begin their assignments on July 1<sup>st</sup>. We pray for them as they begin their new journey in life proclaiming the Gospel message in everything they say and do.

### Saturday Mass Time

In January, we made a decision to change the Saturday Mass time from 5:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. for the winter and early spring months to allow parishioners a little more daylight when traveling to church. I believe that it has worked out quite well and many people have enjoyed the earlier Mass time. However, you might recall that I mentioned that when summer arrives, we will have to return to the original Saturday 5:00 p.m. Mass time for a few months.

Why? Well, we have a number of Saturday afternoon weddings in the next few months and they usually don't conclude until 3:15 p.m. at the very earliest. If there was a delay for any reason, it would be very challenging to manage the wedding party, their families and the weekend Mass congregation in the church and the parking lot.

That being said, on **Saturday, July 2<sup>nd</sup>**, we will return to celebrating the Saturday Evening Mass **at 5:00 p.m.**. Confessions will take place at 4:00 p.m.. This will allow time for weddings to be celebrated and give us enough preparation time for Saturday Mass. There is good news -- we will return to celebrating Saturday Mass at 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, November 5<sup>th</sup>.

### Tri-Parish Weekday Morning Mass

In keeping with the tradition that began a few years ago, the Catholic Communities of St. Alphonsus, Ss. Cyril & Methodius and St. Patrick will move to a **Tri-Parish Weekday Morning Mass** schedule starting **Wednesday, June 1<sup>st</sup>** and concluding on **August 31<sup>st</sup>**. St. Alphonsus Church will host the first month of the Tri-Parish Weekday Masses in the church beginning on **Wednesday, June 1<sup>st</sup>** and concluding on **Thursday, June 30<sup>th</sup>**. The complete summer schedule will continue to be posted in the bulletin for the next few weeks.

## Reflecting on God's Word

Last week we celebrated the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church. This week's scriptures continue to explore the gift of the Holy Spirit, but this time they focus on how the gift of the Holy Spirit binds the church to God in a holy communion of love.

In John's Gospel we hear of the closeness of the Father and the Son. Jesus says, "Everything the Father has is mine" and that the Spirit will pass on what Jesus has to us. The Letter to the Romans helps us realize what it is that we have received: The holy love that is shared between Father and Son "has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us" (Romans 5:5). Not only does our God "delight in the human race" (Proverbs 8:31), care for us, and crown us with glory and honor (Psalm 8:6); through the gift of the Spirit God binds us in a holy communion to the eternal love of the Trinity.

## JOURNEY OF FAITH

We are on a long and eventful journey. Today's readings for Trinity Sunday succinctly cover the depth and breadth of our human travels.

The very beginnings of our journey are revealed in the reading from Proverbs. God's plan filled with divine wisdom was born before the earth was made. In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks of his own personal journey. He has come from the Father and will return to the Father. Only then will the Advocate—the Spirit of Truth—take us onward.

This does not diminish the fact that the journey will be hard. The very setting of the Gospel is the night before Jesus died. As Saint Paul writes to the Romans, "[W]e even boast of our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, and endurance, proven character, and proven character, hope" (Romans 5:3-4).

Ultimately, our human journey is modeled by the Holy Trinity—a family of love among Father, Son, and Spirit that we are all called to emulate.

In addition, they learned how complimentary and contrasting colors work when creating a masterpiece.



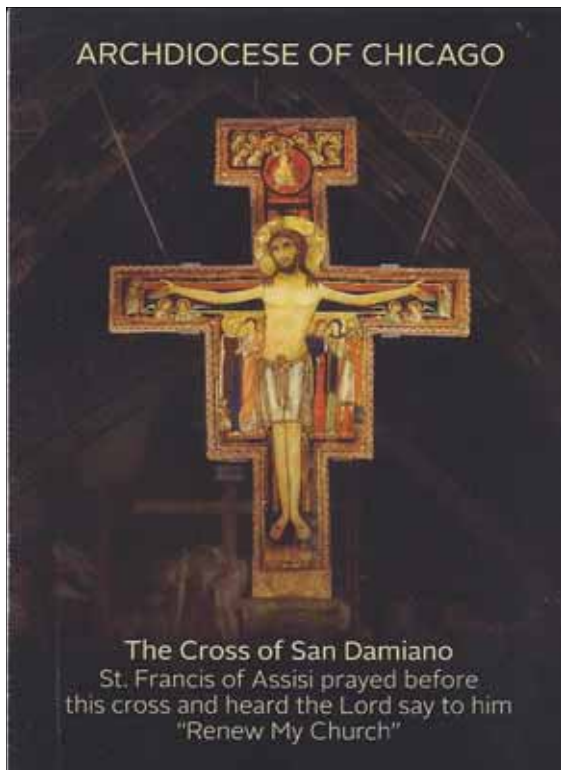

## Jubilee of Mercy May 22, 2016 Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

The word *mercy*, Pope Francis declared in his announcement of the *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, “reveals the very mystery of the Most Holy Trinity” (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 2). For *mercy* is how God comes to meet us; *mercy* is the fundamental law helping us recognize everyone as brothers and sisters; *mercy* is the bridge connecting God and humanity, opening our hearts to the hope of being loved forever despite our sinfulness. God’s self-revelation as a life-giving, love-sharing Trinity of Persons draws us closer to God in friendship and communion. Both Judaism and Islam consider *mercy* one of God’s most important attributes. Israel unceasingly proclaims God boundless mercy. Islam addresses the Creator as “Merciful and Kind,” believing divine mercy limitless, its doors always open. May this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pope Francis prays, open us to more fervent dialogue, deepen our mutual understanding, eliminate all closed-minded disrespect, and drive out every form of violence and discrimination.

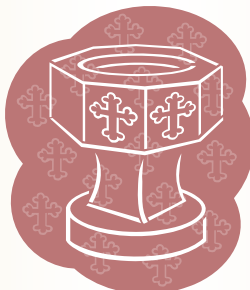
