

Reflecting on God's Word

Two remarkable stories are told in today's first reading from the first book of Kings and in the Gospel of Saint Luke. In the first reading, Elijah visits the house of a widow. Her son falls sick during his visit and eventually stops breathing. Elijah prays to God and breath returns to the child's body, where-upon Elijah returns the boy to his mother. In the Gospel, we hear the remarkable story of the son of another widow. But in this instance, the widow's son is already dead and his remains are in a coffin. This is one of those miracles that draws us in so vividly. Can you even imagine being one of the people standing near the coffin when the young man sits up and begins to speak after Jesus bids him arise? In a striking parallel to the first reading, Jesus gives the young man back to his mother. The people, we are told, are seized with fear. The next thing they do is glorify God.

In our everyday lives, we are most likely not going to experience the raising of a dead person back to life. Yet there are times when the Lord looks at us, helps us recognize our sinfulness or the ways that we prevent life from being lived to the fullest, and says, "I tell you, arise!" (Luke 7:14). A miracle of transformation can occur when we recognize the power of God's love and mercy. Let our response be a prayer of praise and thanks as we glorify God.



HOPE AND LIFE

Today's readings tell the story of two widows. The first reading relates the plight of the widow with whom the prophet Elijah stayed; the Gospel tells about the widow of Nain. In each story, the widow's only son had died. For people who lived in those cultures, the son was the only support of a widow, and the carrying on of the family name by the son was equal to immortality. A widow whose only son has died could lose all hope.

Elijah and Jesus are the restorers of hope; they bring the sons back to life. Saint Paul was metaphorically raised from the dead when he experienced the conversion and call from God that he describes in today's second reading.

What are Christians called to do today? We may not be able to raise the dead, but perhaps we can rekindle hope for a single parent. We may not be able to convert a persecutor like Paul, but if we speak the gospel openly and gently with our lives, we might touch a life with the Good News.

Summer 2016 *Jubilee of Mercy*

Dear Friends in Christ,

On the weekend of June 11-12, 2016, we will take up a special collection for the **Retired Priests of the Archdiocese.**

Throughout the year, I have had several opportunities to meet many of our 206 retired priests who continue to share their priestly ministry in our parishes. It has come to my attention that many parishes depend upon their service for daily and Sunday Masses and for countless funerals. Without the help of our retired priests many parishes would have to reduce Mass schedules and other sacramental services.

In April, it was my honor to celebrate the funeral Mass for Monsignor Richard O'Donnell, our oldest priest. Monsignor O'Donnell was 105 years old when he died. He was ordained a priest in 1935, which means he served as a priest of Chicago for almost 81 years. He spent his retirement years at Our Lady of Good Counsel Parish where he had been pastor. Parishioners visited him every day and somewhere in that time his ministry was returned to him through their care and love.

Our retired priests rely upon your help now. The Priests' Retirement and Mutual Aid Association (PRMAA) cares for our retired priests. As you know the costs for health care, prescription drugs and nursing home care continues to increase. This special collection in June is different from the December collection for retired men and women religious where the collection goes to those in religious orders; Archdiocesan priests do not receive any funds from that collection.

Many thanks to all of you for your most gracious generosity in this collection last year and I ask that you repeat that kindness this year. Your donations, your prayers, and your good wishes are an affirmation of our retired priests. With this letter, I wish to take this opportunity to share my heartfelt appreciation for the ministry and devotion of our retired priests and I ask you to remember all the faithful priests who have gone to their eternal reward. 

Jubilee of Mercy June 5, 2016 **Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Half the liturgical year 2016 is completed after six months of extraordinary celebrations. The Incarnation mystery: Jesus' advent, nativity, epiphany. The Paschal mystery: Jesus' passion, death, resurrection, Pentecost's Holy Spirit. The solemnities of Holy Trinity and Jesus' Body and Blood. Today the Church resumes Sundays in Ordinary Time, but with a Gospel of *extraordinary* mercy: Jesus raises a dead man to life. Yet the one who benefits most from his *extraordinary* mercy is not the dead son but his widowed mother. With her husband and only son deceased, this woman's material support, in that patriarchal society, had vanished. So had her emotional support, leaving her helpless, abandoned, on society's peripheries." One of Pope Francis' hopes in calling this *Extraordinary* Jubilee Year of Mercy is to transform us into more extraordinary Christians, by making our caring outreach to just such vulnerable people, and our practical selfsacrificing love for them, our ordinary, daily, Christian way of life!

Journey of Faith: Birth, Baptism, Belonging

If you are expecting a baby, family and friends have showered you with gifts and you have no doubt furnished and decorated a nursery. In the same way your Catholic community, through the sacrament of Baptism, welcomes and offers spiritual strength and encouragement as your child begins a life-long journey of faith.

Our baptismal preparation program, Journey of Faith: Birth, Baptism, Belonging, is a seminar that will help you better understand the sacrament of Baptism. The seminar can be taken while awaiting the birth of your child or shortly after the baby is born. The seminar will meet on a **Saturday of alternate months** from 9:00 am to Noon in the Religious Education Building. The Seminar dates for 2016 are: July 9th, September 10th and November 12th. If you have not attended a baptismal preparation class at St. Alphonsus in the last three years you must participate in a Baptism seminar. Call the Parish Office at 630-257-2414 to schedule the baptism seminar along with your baptismal date.

I would like to share an excerpt from a SPRED newsletter: "No man is an island. No man stands alone. SPRED recognizes that human beings are not created to go through life alone. The program itself is a lifeline for parents and caregivers in their pursuit of a viable catechetical model for their child with special needs or the person in their care." Are You Registered?

Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and to make a commitment in all its dimensions. It also brings many advantages, recognition and responsibility. Being a registered parishioner makes the process much easier when it is time for infant baptism, school registration, weddings, or when asked to be a baptismal or confirmation sponsor.

Registering here is very simple. You can go to our web page, www.st-als.org, look under "Parish Registration," and fill out the needed information. You can come into the office and fill out a registration form. If your time is limited, you can take the form home and return it via the collection basket on Sundays or mail it to the office.

A registered parishioner receives all parish mailings. Church law advises that territories or boundaries no longer limit parish registration. We accept anyone who wants to share in the life of our parish regardless of where they live.

Remember that you need to be a registered parishioner to partake in all the services that St. Alphonsus offers. Why not sign up? You are surely welcome!
