

Our goal is to provide a spiritual home where all are welcome, where the healing, reconciling, liberating love of God flows through us to all people. In this way, we believe that the Church is the sacrament of God's saving presence in the world.

"Please come to Mass early enough not to disrupt. Leave late enough not to insult (the Mass does not end until the final blessing). Worship reverently enough not to distract. And dress proudly enough not to offend."

Reflecting on God's Word

Kings are not easily cornered. Hamlet has to put on a play to catch the conscience of the king, his own uncle, who has killed Hamlet's father and married his mother. In the passage just prior to today's first reading, the prophet Nathan catches the conscience of Israel's King David by telling the story of a rich man who takes a poor man's beloved and only lamb and serves it up in a stew. When David angrily demands to know who this man is, Nathan replies: "That man is you." David repents. And God forgives.

Jesus catches the conscience of a Pharisee—perhaps. We don't really know if there is any change in Simon after hearing the story. But it is hard to conceive that he did not "get it." Those who know their need for God's mercy receive God's mercy and love in return. Those who do not recognize their need for mercy live their lives refusing to love others. The woman had already known God's forgiveness; she walked in freedom and acted in freedom. No judgments could stop her from honoring the one who had brought her this freedom. So she stood weeping tears of gratitude, trying to mirror the extravagant love she had received. Simon, dry-eyed and dry-hearted, can only denigrate Jesus ("if this man were a prophet") and the woman ("he would know who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him" [7:39]). Simon saw only "a sort of woman."

The heart that has been forgiven is deep enough to hold the love of God and to share it with others. Extravagance begets extravagance. Ask for the gift of a forgiven and forgiving heart.




HOPE AND FORGIVENESS

There were some interesting conceptions of sin prevalent in the time of the Hebrew scriptures. There was the belief that God punished sin immediately. Those who suffered disease or misfortune were, therefore, sinners getting their due from the Almighty.

Today's first reading hints at another kind of God. When David admits his sin, Nathan declares, "The Lord on his part has forgiven your sin" (2 Samuel 12:13b). Here was not a vengeful God but a merciful God. What good news that must have been to David and those who, like him, could be honest enough to admit their sinfulness!

Jesus is the good news of God's mercy and forgiveness incarnate. Without Jesus, perhaps the good news would have been too good to believe, too difficult to imagine. But there he is in today's Gospel, the God-man, forgiving a sinner and declaring that she is forgiven because of her great love.

There is hope, then, for the rest of us sinners, if only we love enough!

Jubilee of Mercy
June 12, 2016
Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's *Jubilee for Those Sick and Suffering Disabilities*, Jesus encounters a woman who is "spiritually ill." She is thus "disabled" from participating in Israel's worshiping community or polite society. Bathing Jesus' feet with tears, drying them with unveiled hair, anointing them (Luke 7:38) risk Jesus' becoming "unclean." Yet his mercy welcomes even such inappropriate behavior as her sincere manifestation of love: "Your sins are forgiven. Go in peace" (7:48, 50). Go not just in "peace," but in *shalom*, the all-enveloping, life-changing assurance of God's mercy. She is anonymous, "known in the city" only as "a sinful woman" (7:37). The character with name and religious title, "Simon the Pharisee" (7:36, 40), judges her harshly, but himself not at all, and thus forfeits God's mercy. This *Jubilee Year of Mercy* challenges us to self-examination. In which role do we most often cast ourselves, humble sinner or judgmental Pharisee? Jesus declares that only by an unfailing willingness to show mercy to fellow sinners can we hope to obtain mercy ourselves (see *Misericordiae Vultus*, 9).

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

It is with great excitement I am announcing the beginning of our pre-production order period for the upcoming recording of HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE ST. ALPHONSUS MUSIC MINISTRY VESPERS. This recording will feature 12 selections from this past year's Advent/Christmas, Lent/Easter, and Songs of Mary Vespers Services.

For quite some time now, many parishioners have asked me when our Music Ministry might make a recording, so as to enjoy the beautiful music that is part of our worship here at St. Alphonsus. On July 29th, we will be teaming up with LEGACY PRODUCTIONS to make this wish come true.

Starting today, you can obtain from any adult member of the music ministry, a business card with the information necessary to order on-line your copy of the recording. The last day for on-line preorders is also July 29th. The cards will have the email address that will take you to our unique and secure order site. The cost for ordering a CD or a Download Code is \$20.00 per copy. We need to sell 96 copies for our break even point. We will earn \$17.50 for each Copy sold thereafter. We hope to sell at least 200 copies.

It is our hope that we, as a ministry, can make a significant contribution toward a fund that will allow us to purchase a new organ for our church. As you know, I cannot use our current instrument because the cost of making it minimally functional is quite high and provides no guarantee of long term reliability. The current instrument was installed in 1972 with an optimum utility of 40 years. The instruments that would be appropriate for our church have now a 50 year utility expectation.

I hope you will support our recording effort, and enjoy in your homes the praise we sing to Our Lord! In so doing, you will help us continue to sing His praises to the best of our ability for many years to come.

Are You Registered?

Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and to make a commitment in all its dimensions. Being a registered parishioner makes the process much easier when it is time for infant baptism, school registration, weddings, or when asked to be a baptismal or confirmation sponsor.

Registering here is very simple. You can go to our web page, www.st-als.org, look under "Parish Registration," and fill out the needed information. You can come into the office and fill out a registration form. If your time is limited, you can take the form home and return it via the collection basket on Sundays or mail it to the office.

A registered parishioner receives all parish mailings. Church law advises that territories or boundaries no longer limit parish registration. We accept anyone who wants to share in the life of our parish regardless of where they live.

Remember that you need to be a registered parishioner to partake in all the services that St. Alphonsus offers. Why not sign up? You are surely welcome!
