### Reflecting on God's Word

Robert Fulghum tells the story of a troubled man who paid a rabbi. He had experienced a great deal of failure in his life and didn't feel that he had what it takes to succeed. After listening to the man's tale of woe, the rabbi instructed him to seek out page thirty of *The Times Almanac*. That would be of help.

Following that instruction, he found that the almanac entry was a list of the greatest hitters in the annals of baseball, with Ty Cobb leading the pack with a .376 batting average. Puzzled that applied to his problem, he returned to the rabbi for an explanation. The rabbi explained that the Hall of Fame hitters represented people who in essence failed about seven out of every ten times at bat.

So if he thought his track record of failure was a problem, he should think again. The many failures put him in league with some of the greatest hitters baseball had ever known.

### PEACE

The greeting of peace at Mass adds substance to a message of today's readings: peace is relational. When we greet in peace the person near us at Mass, we share the touch of a handshake or an embrace, sincere eye contact, and friendly words.

The scriptures speak of a simple peace. The first reading from Isaiah describes the peace of the city, Jerusalem, a place of prosperity and comfort where the Lord's power shall be known to his servants (Isaiah 66:14c).

The Christian understanding of peace changes slightly. Paul tells us that the peace and mercy of God are on all who are created anew. Jesus describes a feeling of peace that will rest on those who accept his disciples and their message.

Peace is both an absence of strife and a personal blessing. We are called to sincerely bring peace to our own lives and we share it with others.

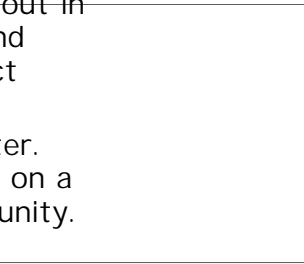
## REGISTRATION FOR 2016-2017

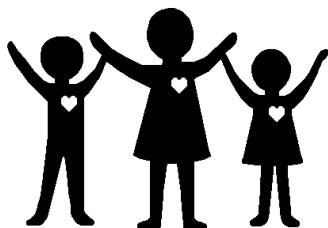
## CONSIDER A MINISTRY AS A CATECHIST

Praying together as family is one of the most important things a parent can do in the formation of our children. The following is a list of ideas on prayer.

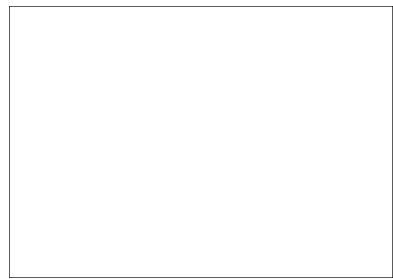
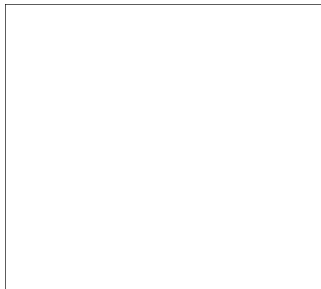
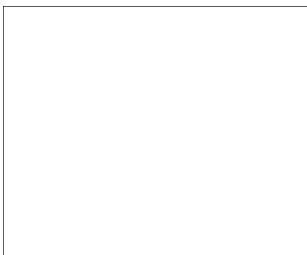
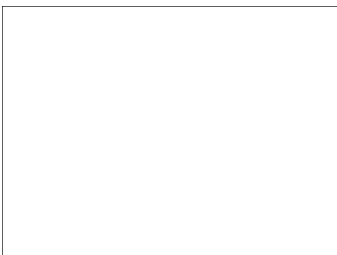
- Offer a prayer when you're facing an unpleasant task.

- Say a prayer for guidance when you are at a loss and don't know what to do next. God help!

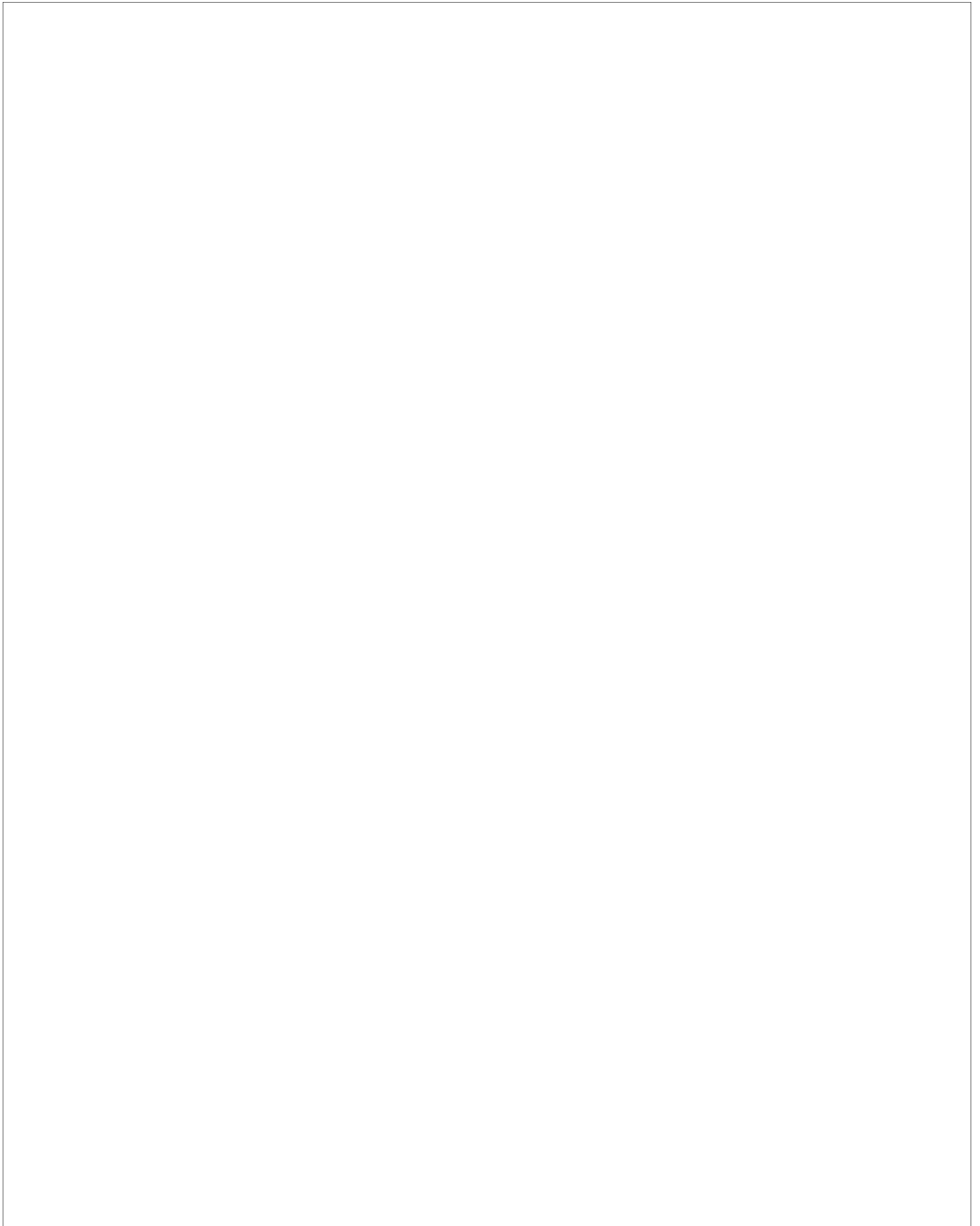
## OUR 2-WEEK RE INTENSIVE PILOT IS COMPLETE!

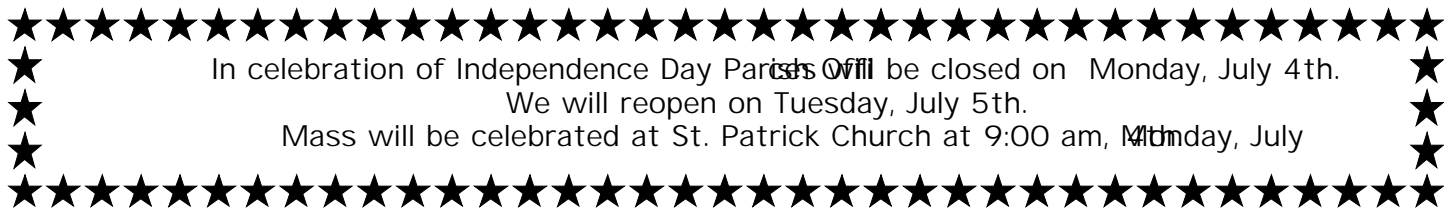

belongs to our 3 lead catechists, Bill, Diane Kaye, and Angela Pascente.

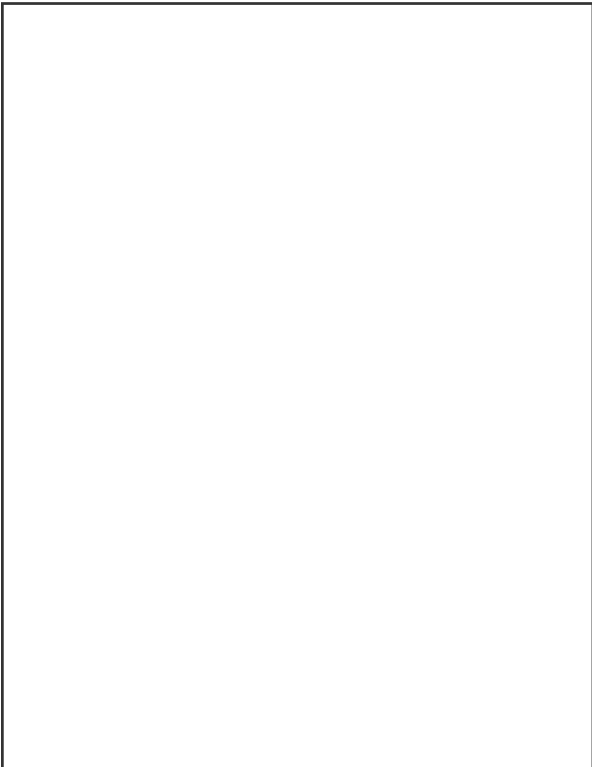

**Jubilee of Mercy**  
**July 3, 2016**  
**Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Last Sunday, Jesus rebuked James and John for wanting to call down fire from heaven (Luke 9:54-55) on an unwelcoming town. As he sends forth disciples today, Jesus again forbids retaliation against non-receptive listeners (10:10-11), showing us how to be Jesus' missionaries of mercy ~~in the~~ *Year of Mercy*. Like the first disciples, we are sent not to proclaim ourselves but Jesus. Jesus sent them in pairs, so ~~also we~~ we work together in the community of the Church. We often describe the Church as Isaiah describes Jerusalem in today's first reading, our comforting, nurturing Mother (Isaiah 66:13). So, going forth gently, like lambs among wolves (Luke 10:3), we share comforting peace, nurturing food and drink (Luke's image for Eucharist), and Jesus' healing promise of unfailing, unconditional ~~mercy~~ (10:5, 7, 9). Thus Jesus bids us proclaim the kingdom of ~~God~~ by showing what God's kingdom looks like in action. Go, preach the Gospel, Pope Francis' saintly namesake of Assisi is said to have instructed his first friars: and when necessary, use words!

- You are a baptized Catholic not raised in the faith and would like to receive Eucharist and Confirmation.

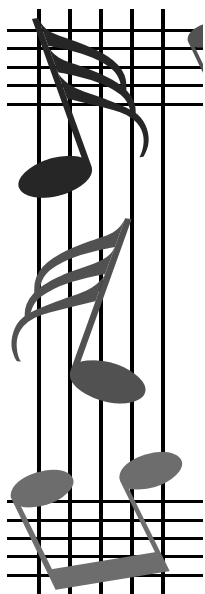

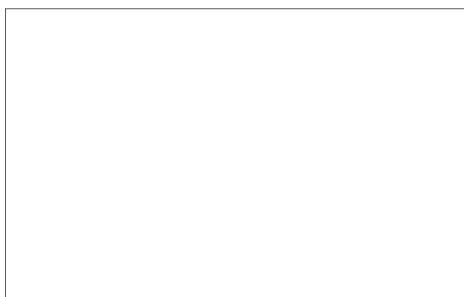
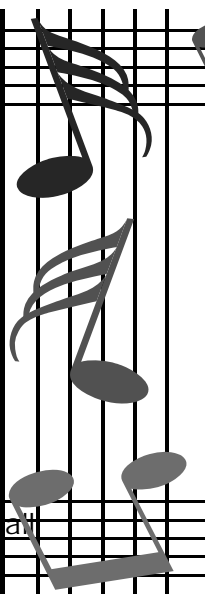


**Music On The Lawn**

You can come into the office and fill out a registration form. If your time is limited, you can take the form home and return it via the collection basket on Sundays or mail it to the office.

A registered parishioner receives all parish mailings. Church law advises that territories or boundaries no longer limit parish registration. We accept anyone who wants to share in the life of our parish regardless of where they live.

Remember that you need to be a registered parishioner to partake in all the services that St. Alphonsus offers. Why not sign up? You are surely welcome!
