Reflecting on God's Word

When he had learned that Jim and Trudy were becoming Catholic he had erupted in condemnation. They had not spoken since then.

DISCIPLINE

It is no accident that the words "disciple" and "discipline" are nearly identical. Their relationship in Christian faith and life, however, has fallen somewhat out of favor in the past generation, as certain prescribed Church rules and regulations have been reduced and relaxed. These rules were often referred to as "disciplines." We are mistaken, however, to think that it no longer takes discipline to follow Christ. The Letter to the Hebrews assures us of that today. Our discipline is more like that of an athlete pursuing a victory or a personal best, or a musician striving for a concert career or to master a new piece of music. This discipline comes from desire, not from regulations. It was the desire to do the will of God that led Jesus on the path to his cross. It is that same desire he encourages in us today: to strive to enter through the narrow gate, to find ourselves in the kingdom with a surprising assortment of people who are there not because of mere observation of rules, but out of a genuine desire to recline at the table of the heavenly banquet.

HELPING CHILDREN UNDERSTAND THE ELECTIONS

Children can learn about key themes that Catholics should take into consideration in the political sphere when they are presented in a developmentally appropriate way. Here is the talking point of the week presented by Child psychologist, Dr. Joseph White:

THE CALL TO FAMILY, COMMUNITY AND PARTICIPATION: God gives us families to help us learn how to love one another and so we can learn who God is. Our parish community also helps us to learn about God.

Talk about it: How can we work together in our families, parish communities, school or neighborhood to take care of one another and become the people God made us to be? How do we participate in the communities that surround us?

WHY HESITATE TO BE A CATECHIST?

I've had an ongoing article with catechists stating reasons they saw for being a catechist. This is the 3rd of another ongoing article sharing a list of reasons put together by a religious educator on why people hesitate to become catechists. Here is one of them:

"...I'm not sure that I know just what the Church teaches. I'm afraid I'll say something wrong."

Our textbooks are in conformity with the Catechism of the Catholic Church. That means that everything in our textbooks is in line with what the Church teaches. The key here is never to guess at what the Church teaches. If you don't know, just say, "I'm not sure, let me get back to you" and ask the Religious Ed Office or consult the Catechism online. The related paragraph numbers in the Catechism are referenced in the Catechist Guide and Student Book.

This two part workshop focuses first on the Spirituality of proclaiming the Word of God and examines closely the role of the lector/proclaimer and his/her relationship with the Word. The second half focuses on proclamation skills, examining various techniques and how they can make you a more effective lector. Dr. Marcheschi will give very practical training on how to proclaim to ensure delivery that honors the presence of Christ in his Word.

Graziano Marcheschi has an M.A. in Theater from the University of Minnesota, an M.Div. from Loyola University Chicago and a D.Min from University of St. Mary of the Lake Seminary. Currently, Vice President for Mission and Ministry at St. Xavier University, Graziano is a former advisor to the Subcommittee on Lay Ecclesial Ministry of the USCCB and member of the Board of Directors of the National Assoc. for Lay Ministry. As an author, educator and storyteller, Graziano speaks frequently at national gatherings on ministry and catechesis. He has authored nine volumes of Workbook for Lectors and Gospel Readers, including the 2016 edition (LTP). He and his wife, Nancy, lead prayer through the performing arts at conferences and prayer gatherings locally and nationally.

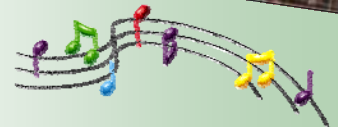
