The priest was a little dismayed, but he decided to set out for Regenberg to see the man who would be his companion. With that thought, he tried to console himself.

In Regenberg, the priest found the butcher working quietly at his trade. He asked him if he had been a butcher all his life. I have two elderly parents and they place a heavy burden on the daily tasks of life. As a result, much of my time is consumed in their care. Every day I must care for them, and feed them. And there is the cleaning and washing of clothes."

The priest, with tears in his eyes, knelt down, kissed the hands of the butcher, and thanked God for giving him a place in heaven next to a man of such great distinction.

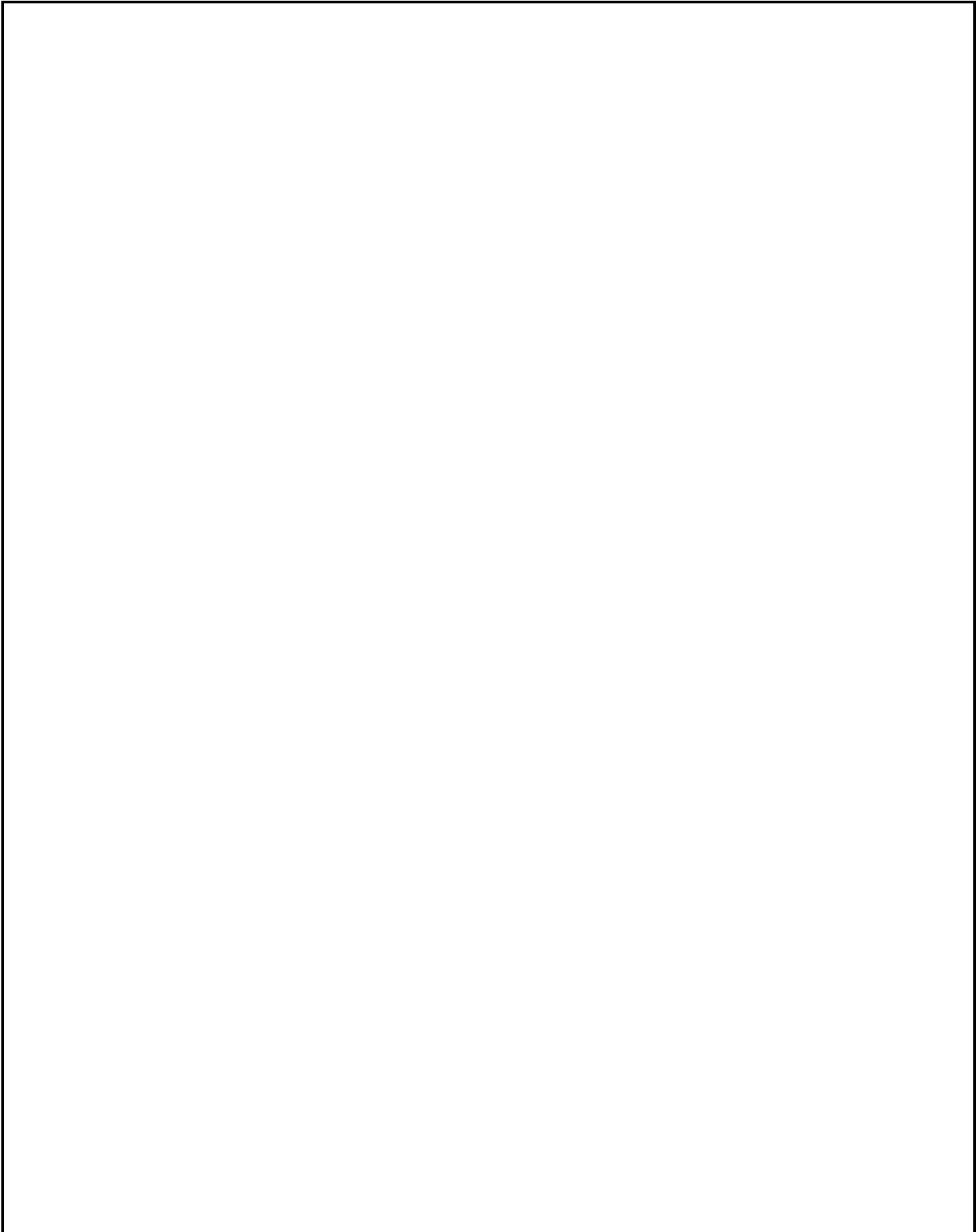
CONSIDER A MINISTRY AS A CATECHIST

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

With the ending of summer at hand, I once again find myself looking forward to another year of serving you as Director of Music Ministry. It is amazing to realize this is my eighteenth year at St. Alphonsus. A harsh reality of this, however, is the loneliness I feel of our wonderful young adult musicians heading to college or beyond. Many of them have been serving our parish through music since they were little children. This reality is also what has led me to my note to you.

Our Music Ministry is in need of NEW TALENT! All choir instrument ensembles could use your talents and time. I know there are wonderful voices sitting in the pews, please join us! If you enjoy singing as part of your worship, please allow me to find a way for you to share your gift with our parish community. The Instrument Ensemble also needs additional string instruments, flutes and woodwinds, brass players. If you are at least in the 8th grade with three or more years of training, WE NEED YOU!!! The Instrument Ensemble has always been the most unique facet of our weekly music ministry. I need your help to continue this tradition.

Fr. Brian, the Worship Commission, and I spoke at length regarding this. This year we will continue our small choral ensemble at the 11:00 am Mass on a weekly basis. Both vocalists and instrumentalists are welcome. The music selected for the Liturgy will be a mixture of contemporary and traditional. I am hoping this ensemble will encourage those who prefer attending that Mass to increase their participation with us. Rehearsals for this choir will coincide with the Parish Choir on Thursday at 7:30 pm. The Children's Choir will continue to rehearse and sing only once each month. We will meet at 3:20 pm on Saturday of each month, and prepare the music used at the 5:00 pm Mass that day. Later this fall we will have time for (3) one-hour rehearsals for children wishing to sing at the 3:30 pm Mass on Christmas Eve. The Choir will continue to play at the 5:00 pm Mass on the second and fourth Saturdays of the month. Rehearsal times are 6:00-7:15 pm on the Thursdays and 90 minutes on an assigned Mass. We welcome children and adults to our ministry as well. The Parish choir will be splitting its ministry between the 9:00 am and 11:00 am Masses on the fourth Sunday of each month. The Choir will continue to sing at the 9:00 Mass all other Sundays. We are in need of additional volunteer cantors for choir Masses. Training will be one-on-one or group. All else in the ministry will remain the same.

The Parish Choir. Open to all parishioners above the age of 13. This choir serves our parish with all of the weekly and seasonal liturgical worship through music. This choir serves to reinforce the weekly scripture. The music ranges from our liturgically pasted the most recent sacred contemporary.

The Children's Choir Open to children in grades 3-8. Children in 7th grade and above may also participate in a Youth Cantor Program.

The Volunteer Cantor Ministry. Providing song leadership to the assembly at all designated liturgies with music. The cantor ministry will also provide small ensemble singing at selected non-choir liturgies.

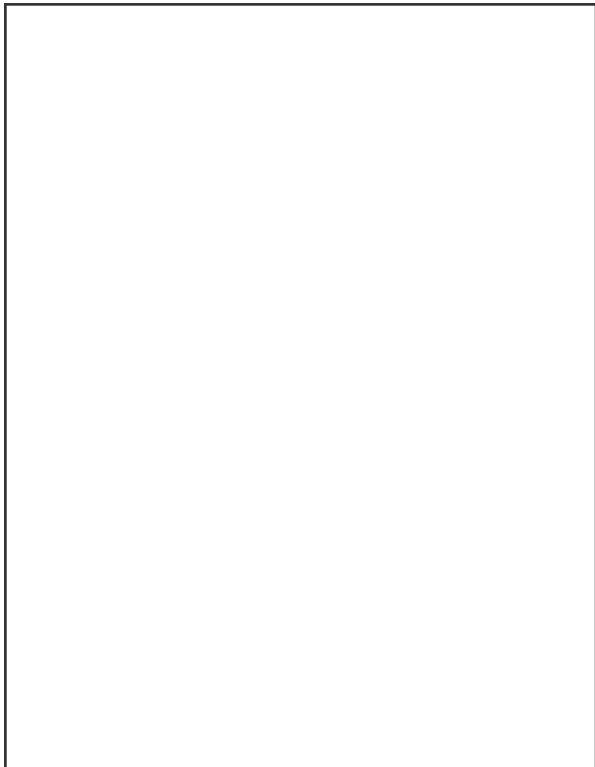

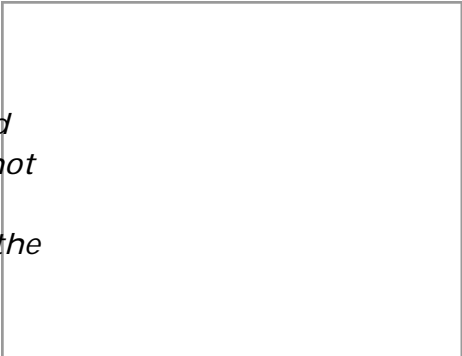

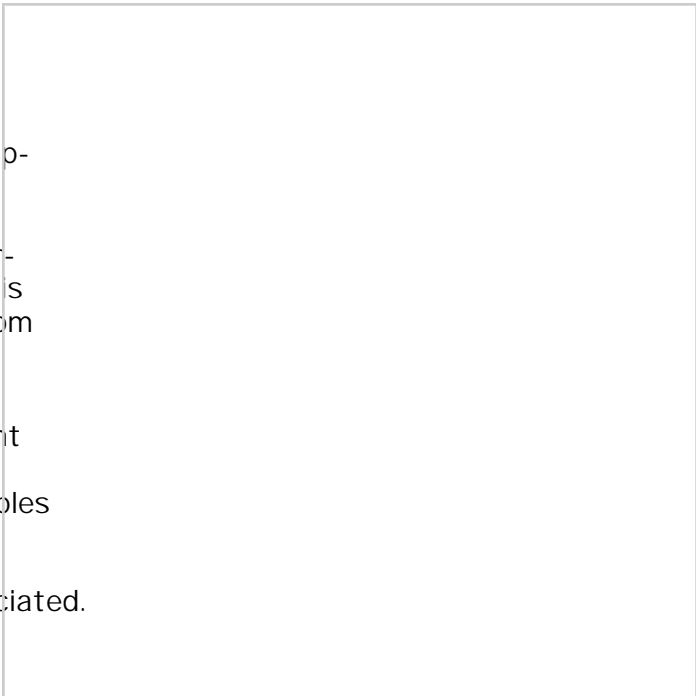
