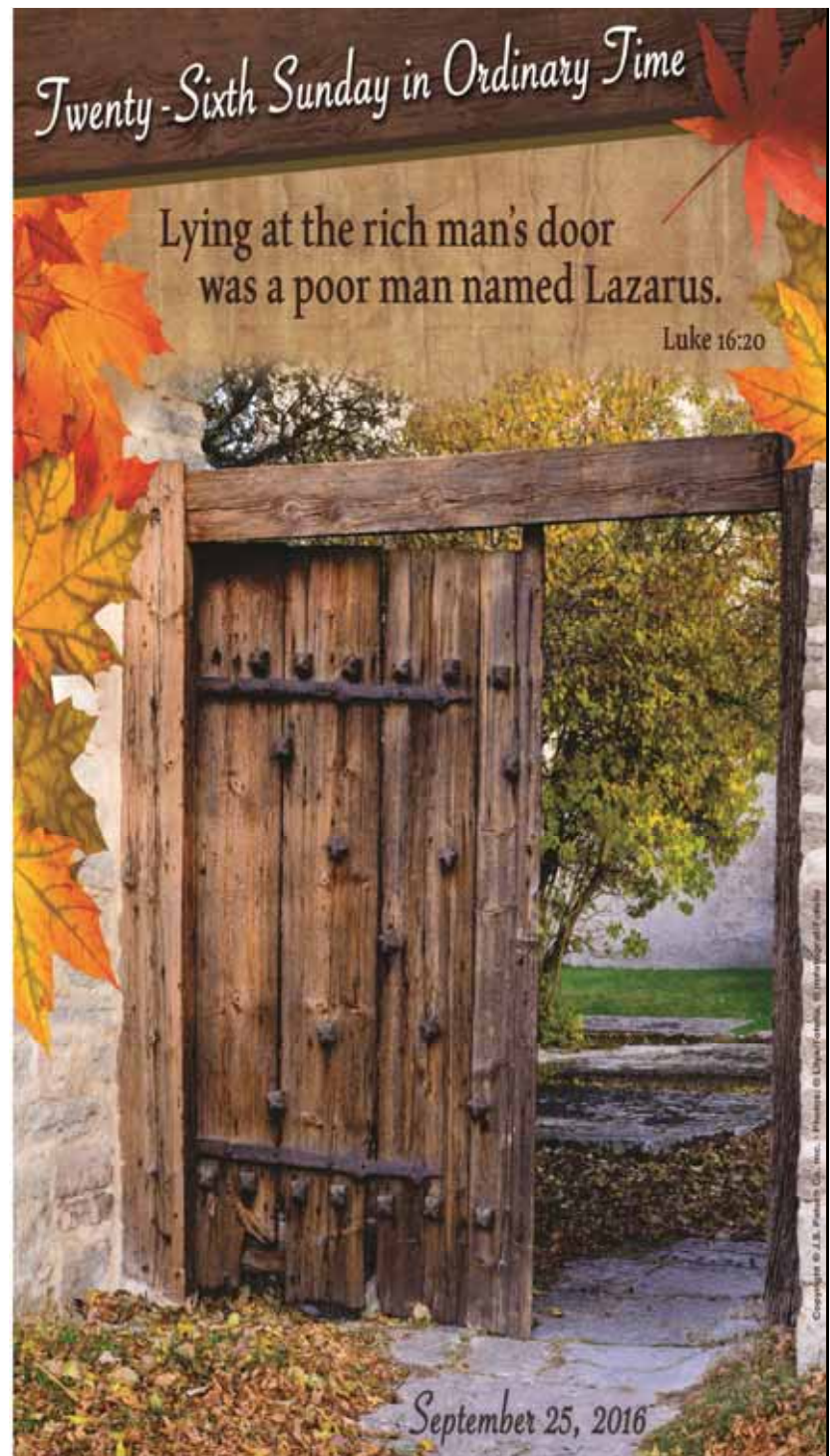

Respect Life

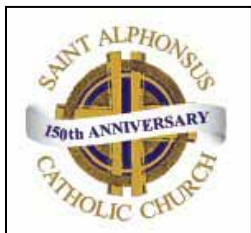

St. Al/St. Pat's School Awarded "Fuel Up to Play 60" NFL Flag Essentials Grant Award

Students in grades 3 - 5 started their Flag Football unit this past week thanks to "Fuel Up to Play 60" and the NFL. The school received an NFL FLAG essentials kit valued at \$320 that included the following equipment:

- 10 footballs
- 50 flag belts
- Elementary NFL FLAG football curriculum
- NFL team customized recognition certificates for students
- NFL FLAG poster for school gymnasium
- Welcome letter from Fuel Up to Play 60 & NFL FLAG

The unit focuses on the skills needed to play flag football, a non-contact sport. Students are learning how to run with the ball, how to throw and catch the ball, how to punt the ball, and the basics of offensive and defensive positions. All lessons include fun games with each new skill.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Last year, in speaking to a conference in Rome, Pope Francis reminded the participants that “the vocation to the priesthood is a gift that God gives to some for the good of all.” This weekend as we celebrate and pray for our own seminarians in the Archdiocese of Chicago, I ask you once again for your financial support of them.

We currently have sixty-seven seminarians preparing for a life of service as your future pastors. Their motivation and enthusiasm for serving in the Church through a life-long commitment is inspiring to us all, promoting us to offer in return our prayers, fraternal encouragement and financial support. Many of you have personally told me how much you enjoy meeting our seminarians whenever they visit parishes and I know you come away from those experiences with a renewed sense of hope for the future.

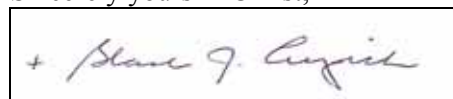

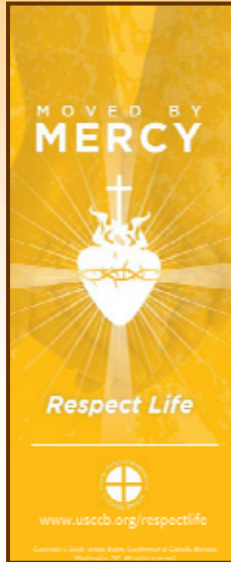

Why white crosses on the lawns of Lemont churches?

The white crosses on the church lawns represent the lives lost through abortion. Since abortion was legalized in 1973, over 57 million children have lost their lives, and the lives of their parents and family members have been forever changed. These crosses also remind us of the message that Christ died for all sins and His forgiveness is for everyone. A single gray cross represents the women who have lost their lives to abortion.

40 Days For Life

Recently a full-page ad was placed in the Chicago Tribune (by an organization that claimed to be Catholic) which promoted abortion as a social good. Cardinal Dolan quickly denounced the ad as deceptive and untrue while quoting Pope Francis: “Life must always be welcomed and protected. . . from conception to natural death. All of us are called to respect life and care for it.”

We, as Catholics, are asked to show our support for life in whatever capacity we are able. “40 Days for Life” is a worldwide campaign which unites Catholics and other Christians in the common goal of promoting life. The campaign takes place on an annual basis—this year from September 28th through November 6th. During these six weeks, Christians from all over the world come together in a spirit of unity through prayer, fasting and peaceful vigil to show support for life and a desire to end abortion.

During this 40 day period there are opportunities to grow in our support of life and to give public witness to our support. We can participate through personal prayer, fasting, communal prayer or peaceful activism. Our Lemont Respect Life Ministry will meet on the sidewalk on
