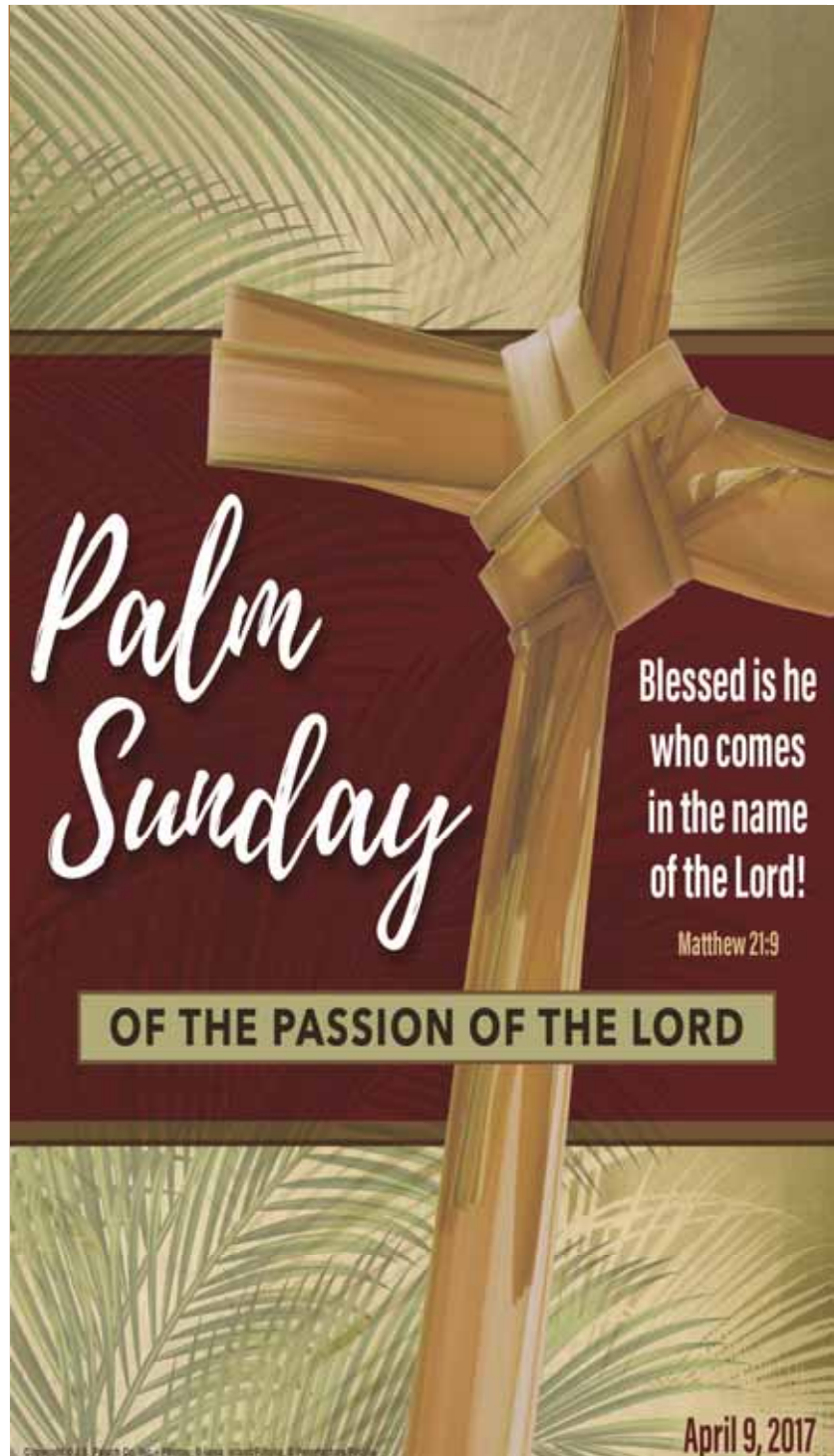

From Father Brian's Desk

Holy Week Events

As we celebrate **Palm Sunday** this weekend, it gives us an opportunity to reflect on the life of Jesus, but also be proud of who we are as Christians. Palm Sunday was a joyous time for the followers of Jesus over 2000 years ago as they waved their palm branches proclaiming Jesus as their new king. We, as Christians and Catholics, realize that Palm Sunday is the beginning of the holiest week of the year. That being said, I would like to invite you to take advantage of some of the opportunities for prayer this **Holy Week**.

On **Monday, April 10th**, there will be a wonderful chance to prepare for Easter through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Our annual **Lemont Tri-Parish Reconciliation Service** will take place at **Ss. Cyril & Methodius Church** from **5:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.** and from **7:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m.**. There will be a number of priests present who will listen to Confession and share the great prayer of Absolution. Some of the priests will be able to listen to Confession in English and Polish.

Holy Thursday is a great celebration of the Last Supper and the idea of service to others. During our Holy Thursday Liturgy on **April 13th at 7:00 p.m.**, members of the parish are invited to wash the feet of those who are in the congregation as a remembrance of Jesus washing the feet of the Apostles. After the conclusion of the Holy Thursday Liturgy, the church will remain open until **11:00 p.m.** for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

On **Good Friday**, we recall the death of our Lord Jesus Christ. On Friday, **April 14th at 3:00 p.m.**, we will offer a *Good Friday Prayer Service with Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion*.

The **Easter Vigil** on **Saturday, April 15th at 7:00 p.m.** is considered by the Catholic Church as the greatest celebration of our faith. Not only do we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, but we also welcome our new members into our community through Baptism, First Eucharist and Confirmation.

The commemoration of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ at the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday is a wonderful occasion to be proud to be called Christian and Catholic. Through prayers, readings, music and song, we come together as a community of believers in Jesus, but we also thank God for everything that we have already.

Please join us for the holiest week of the Church year as we celebrate our faith!

Welcome Guests and Visitors . . . We're so glad that you're here and invite you to join us in thanksgiving for God's action in our lives. Our goal is to provide a spiritual home where all are welcome, where the healing, reconciling, liberating love of God flows through us to all people. In this way, we believe that the Church is the sacrament of God's saving presence in the world.

"Please come to Mass early enough not to disrupt. Leave late enough not to insult (the Mass does not end until the final blessing). Worship reverently enough not to distract. And dress proudly enough not to offend."

Reflecting on God's Word

Today's Gospel before the blessing of the palms presents an exuberant scene. Imagine the large crowd just outside Jerusalem spreading their cloaks on the road, breaking off palm fronds, strewing them about and waving them as Jesus passes by. Hear the people shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David." As Jesus enters the city, the people there are asking, "Who is this?" The crowd accompanying him answers: "This is Jesus the prophet, from Nazareth of Galilee. This is the one who comes in the name of the Lord." A journey of joy.

But a few days later Jesus took his last journey: a winding walk from the upper room on Thursday night out to the garden of Gethsemane, then to the house of Caiaphas, on to Pilate's house and courtyard, and, finally, to the hill of Calvary. During this time, he was spat on and struck, stripped, scourged, and crowned with thorns; he was denounced, mocked, and ridiculed. Most likely some of the same crowd that cried out "Hosanna" cried out, "Crucify him!" It ended with his being nailed to a cross, and after three torturous hours, he died. At this journey's end, there was one final cry from a small group, a centurion and the men with him: "Truly, this was the Son of God!" (Matthew 27:54).

Allow some time to relive these two journeys. You might hear some things you haven't noticed before. Perhaps the words of one of the secondary characters or Jesus' response to a particular situation or his silence before another will speak to you this time.

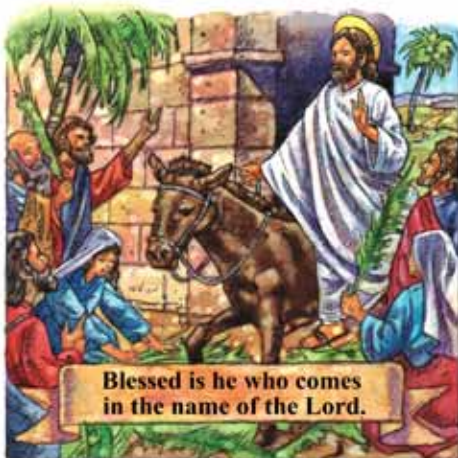

SEEING CHRIST CLEARLY

We start today looking through the portals of Jerusalem, seeing crowds of people, cheering and waving palm branches in the air. The whole atmosphere is one of joy, triumph, and celebration. We can get distracted or enthralled by the scene, and not see clearly the features of Jesus as he enters. But our readings from Isaiah and Paul's letter to the Philippians clarify his features for us. He is the Suffering Servant, meek and mute before his captors and persecutors; he is the very image of the unseen God, yet will not clutch at equality with God before he endures his final confrontation in humility. Isaiah and Paul help us "behold the Lamb of God" before we hear the story of his final and greatest confrontation. It is important that we see Christ clearly before we hear the account of his passion, for we—his Body through baptism, the church—now bear his face. We must, with him, enter into this time of trial so we can, also with him, enter into his final triumph.
